MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



WITHIN A YEAR of being ordained in 2003, I was asked to lead a conversation among my 3point parish about

sexuality. I was a 26 year old newlywed still learning how to preach, read a budget and drive around Cashton without hitting any Amish buggies. I had no idea how to tackle such a controversial topic. So... I jumped in head first. Mostly because I, myself, wasn't sure where I landed within the whole conversation. About twenty people of all ages and gender gathered multiple times to study a resource together that walked us through Scripture, tradition and the actual experiences of human beings. I learned a lot about the potential of a Christian congregation through those

gatherings. I learned a lot about God. And I learned a lot about myself.

Since then. I have had critical or difficult conversations pertaining to: homeschooling, the minimum wage, the placement of the American flag within a church building, whether it's appropriate to render military honors on a church campus, same-gender marriages, the consideration of anaphylactic allergies among our members, Israel & its relationship to the Palestinians, climate change, the way we staff our church and SO MUCH MORE. And in each and every conversation, no matter how flustered or embarrassed or maddened I became, I genuinely believed that what I was participating in was healthy and

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN



THERE HAVE BEEN few moments of quiet in my life of late. Time for reflection is squeezed into the drive home or at the end of the day before I fall asleep. In

the normal course of things, this time between Christmas and Lent lends itself well for deeper reflection and intention setting, but alas, that was not the case for 2020. As a result, I find myself craving, needing, time to be still and to wonder and remember and grow. Which has me reaching for the book we read last Lent, Holy Solitude: Lenten Reflections with Saints. Hermits. Prophets and Rebels by Rev. Heidi Havercamp. Holy solitude is exactly what my spirit is clamoring for and what better time (other than the "quiet" season after Epiphany) to carve out time for this than Lent?

Lent will find many in our congregation talking about the book *Waking Up White* by Debby Irving. As we join others in our community to read this important book, we are going to feel uncomfortable, sad, angry, frustrated and so much more. I don't know about you, but I don't like to feel any of those things most days, but I do know that those are the feelings that move me to change, if I can be curious about what is behind them. But that curiosity can only come if I allow myself the time and space to think, to reflect, to be still and in the moments, hear the voice of the Spirit reminding me that I am imperfect, but I am enough.

Which brings me back to my friend Heidi and her book. As much as I love the stories she shares about the faithful who have gone before me, I have found deep value in her suggestions for carving out time to practice the disciplines of Lent. As we are a week away from Ash Wednesday, she

faithful. Difficult conversations grow groups of people from strangers who simply cross paths to brothers and sisters in Christ. Within these conversations, stupid, thoughtless things get said sometimes. I have seen that move some people to leave or never return. But most come back more invested, more engaged and more willing to be church together because of the confession that was then offered and the forgiveness that was then given. Reconciling our thoughts and feelings within a group of Christians is how we learn to be better neighbors to everyone else! Whether it's our family, our co-workers, classmates or anyone else, we do better at those relationships if we practice the hard parts of relating to people at church.

That's why I believe in Lenten small groups at First, especially as we've

begun (and it's not too late this week to join one) Waking Up White small groups. Yes, the book is the launching point for these conversations. But facilitators are trained to share other quotes, show some video clips and even encourage the groups to listen to the 1619 podcast. And, yes, people will say things that may land poorly with others. But, if you are white like me, how else can we learn to be better neighbors to people of color if we don't talk about it? Ask questions about it? And explore our own relationship to the narrative of the dominant white culture?

Thank you to all who are jumping in head first, bravely offering your willingness to learn about yourself, your congregation, your neighbors and your God.



FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT



AS MEMBERS OF First Lutheran Church and through our financial gifts, we commit to bringing people into a relationship

with Jesus Christ. Through our unique place in our community and the size of our congregation, we are able to Change the Lives of people of all ages and make more disciples of Christ. Visitors and new members are warmly welcomed to our fellowship with Christ by our Hospitality Leadership Team. They are most visible through their presence in the welcome center each Sunday. Behind the scenes, they do first-time visitor follow up with phone calls, postcards and letters, Welcome baskets are provided to new people in the community. They also organize the Icicle Sock Tree (335 socks collected

last Christmas) and Giving Tree. We thank you for your continuing contributions to make these programs a success.

In January, at our annual potluck, our congregation voted to move forward with a balanced budget of \$776,100. That number allows us to provide modest raises for our staff while keeping up with our current ministry and facility costs. We will be giving 9.5% of the congregation's regular offerings to the synod, 1% to Campus Ministry, 1% to Sugar Creek Bible Camp and .5% to Lutheran Social Services. This makes our congregation's benevolence at nearly 12% before special difts are designated from our members. First Lutheran continues to be at the top of our synod's givers to our La Crosse

Area Synod, our camp, our campus ministry and LSS. Thank you to everyone who attended our annual meeting and helped us plan for a great 2020!

Capital Campaign update: This is the third and final year of the Capital Campaign. As we look forward to everyone fulfilling their pledge by the end of 2020, we will have made great strides improving our buildings and reducing our debt.Planning is underway for replacement of the sanctuary roof once the weather allows. It is great to report we have received over 68% of the pledged income for the capital campaign. Thank you for continuing to meet your pledge. Full financial details are available by request in the church office. We welcome everyone to attend a finance committee meeting. We meet every month, on the second Wednesday at noon. The coffee is free but bring your own lunch. The Stewardship Committee meets once a month and is looking for members. For meeting times, contact Pastor Stanton.



In February, I (Pastor Stanton) led a Faith Alive! U course called, "Lutheran Worship... Why?" It was meant to explain why we do the things we do in worship. To what purpose? For whose sake? The short answer, of course, is that we do each and every piece of worship in an effort to be a better neighbor once we leave the worship space. But there are some things that deserve a little more direct response. I asked each person present to write down a couple questions... Here's one:

"Why do Lutherans not kneel during church?"

My short answer: because we don't have kneelers here! My longer answer: if we followed our order of worship through the red books in our pews, we'd see an optional direction offered here and there. At the confession, for example, it says, "The assembly kneels or stands." Many Lutherans across the country DO kneel for confession, the prayers and at communion. Kneeling is simply a prayer posture that many find helpful while many others find painful. Of course, how we pray is less important than praying with an open heart. So, feel free to kneel. Or not. You are free indeed.
