#### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON**



LAST MONTH MY newsletter recounted the ways we remain behaving as Church together despite not gathering in person

and despite our social distancing. I said, "We worship", "We give" and "We serve." It continues to be true. Whether we are celebrating our Senior Class of 2020 on May 17 with a cupcake Sunday and so much more, or engage in the Pentecost Project that made May 31's service especially multi-lingual, our worship numbers remain steady. Financial giving in April was incredibly generous and brought us closer to meeting our budgeted income through four months of 2020. And we do continue to serve as you care for your neighbors, reach out to your family and oftentimes go an extra mile to keep yourself and loved ones safe. Thank

you for all the ways you continue to be the Church!

In May, your elected and called leaders sent a letter explaining how difficult it will be for us to gather in person. The safety of those who enter our buildings is our #1 concern. With that priority, it looks very realistic that many more months could pass before we reunite for worship that gathers hundreds. We continue to evaluate how we might accommodate small groups, special services and outside groups. But until Wisconsin has sustained a decrease in confirmed cases and met other gating criteria to achieve, at least, phase three of the Badger Bounce Back Plan. First Lutheran will worship via live stream and continue to innovate our way

#### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN**

"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God."



IN MY MAY 19 Morning Musing, I shared this verse and the impact it is having on me right now. I have been deeply

challenged by these words. This pandemic has not been easy on a whole host of levels, and while I am grateful for all that I have, I too have struggled with the range of emotions and reactions that have come over me as I make my way through this with everyone else. There are days when loving people seems nearly impossible. And yet, loving people is the very lens, the very ground, the very heart of everything I do or say. It is what defines me (and all followers of Jesus) because God first loved me (and everyone else) through Jesus.

That was easier to live out three months ago.

I have been studying human behavior for a while now, so I am really good at doing all the intellectual analysis as to why I am struggling or why others are behaving the way they are and usually that is helpful to me, but not right now. Right now isn't a matter of knowing, it isn't a matter of the intellect. It is a matter of how we "be", it is a matter of the heart. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians that knowledge is not the end all and be all (and that is saying a lot coming from him), that knowledge must be tempered with love. Knowledge just thrown about becomes a stumbling block to others and prohibits their ability to hear or understand or want to do either of those things. So in a

through this unique chapter. If you or someone you know could use some help with technology so that they can engage in worship and all the other content we're offering, please share their name with the church office. We want to help so that "all are welcome" to First, even if it's virtual!

We could dwell on what is NOT happening at First. We could sulk in the misery of no coffee fellowship between services, no Sunday School, no choir. We could remain frustrated and pessimistic about what this might do to our church in the long run, as though it could only be to our detriment. I, however, will not. Your staff and the Vision & Leadership Team aren't thinking about what is NOT happening. We're moving into something new. I'm not saying we're thrilled to have to recreate almost every wheel. But we do see this quarantine time as a time of opportunity when we can create some new systems, learn some new skills and BÉ the church in new ways. Program churches like First Lutheran can get lost in doing, doing, doing. Now that we can't do what we always did, each and every one of us is forced to re-evaluate our faith practices and how effectively we are growing in faith, hope and love.

How is your faith, hope and love going? Is it getting deeper, broader and stronger? If you're not sure how to answer that question, I've got some ideas for you! (Keep reading.)

Six days a week, Pastor Karyn and I offer a "Morning Musing" that considers, "Where Is God In All This?" (WIGIAT) We post it to our Facebook page and the First Lutheran Youtube channel by 8:00am. Kathryn Pedretti leads prayer daily at 4:10pm on Facebook. Once a week, Pastor Karyn creates a "Practicing Spirituality" post. And at some point in June, I will be inviting everyone into a daily Bible study where we read just a few chapters a day for a year. We'll get through the whole thing—together! My vision for the post-COVID church includes a healthy

amount of daily/weekly online content from pastors and staff.

But... the Church beyond 2020 will not be driven by pastors. In a world where each person seeks to build their own unique identity, shares posts onto their own 'story' and lives a very singular life, the Church will require greater engagement from its members than passive consumers offer. Each and every member will need to share their own perspective on the One God. For our church to thrive and grow, every single one of you will need to contribute questions, ideas and faith stories.

Here's one example of what that could look like... During the last quarter of school—at home—my 4th-grader would start each and every day by watching the 'announcements' provided by her school. These were simple videos recorded by a rotation of teachers who read a script: "Good morning... today is a day \_\_\_\_\_...

the weather is... today's birthdays are... and it's National \_\_\_\_\_\_ Day." Then, they'd say the pledge of allegiance and sign off with, "Have a great day!" And that was it. 2-3 minutes tops. It became a ritual that acted as a portal for my daughter from non-school home time to school (at home) time.

What if we had a rotation of 200

church members at First who each recorded a simple 2–3 minute "Bible Bits" video saying, "Hello! My name is \_\_\_\_\_\_. I've been a member at First since \_\_\_\_\_ and I just love (at our Church). Psalm \_\_\_\_\_ is my favorite part of the Bible because my \_\_\_\_\_ told me \_\_\_\_\_ when \_\_\_\_\_ happened in my life. [Read the text you chose, maybe something more about it.] Remember, God loves you and so do all your friends at First Lutheran Church where all are welcome! Have a great day!"

A daily Bible Bit would be a fun, simple ritual that could help us all get to know another person at church, open our Bibles and maybe even connect beyond what we do in person. Details on how to upload your Bible Bit can be found on the left side of this page.

Let's all take advantage of the opportunity before us to engage with each other as church even more deeply than we ever did before. I'll 'see' you online!

many people are trying to impart knowledge with love, and it is not being received well... in a time of high anxiety, you can only change how you react, behave and love.

situation like a pandemic, when our lives are so tightly bound to the lives and actions of our neighbor, we as followers of Jesus temper our knowledge with love.

If you watched or listened to my sermon on Wednesday, May 20, you heard me wrestle with what does this love look like? I know that there are many people who are trying to act in love, and their love is not being received as such. So many people are trying to impart knowledge with love, and it is not being received well. So how do we love one another in a time of high anxiety? Well, I keep finding myself going back to this one truth: We cannot will someone to change, we can only change ourselves. In a time of high anxiety, such as we find ourselves in, I (or you) can only change how I (or you) react, how I (or you) behave, how I (or you) love. For me, that means spending time asking myself, what is behind my reactions so that I can then

see others in a more generous way, so that I can love others.

There are no easy answers here, but friends, we have been preparing for such a time as this for many years, as we learned from each other and from Jesus, as we challenged ourselves to love one another even when we disagree, as we came to God over and over again to ask for forgiveness when we get it wrong. We have the tools needed to find our way through if we do it together.

"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God." has a depth and breadth to it that we have never known until this moment, and we don't always manage it, but we hold strongly to the truth that we were first loved by our God, and we don't lose that when we forget or don't quite know how to love one another. We return to that love, bathe in God's grace, and we start again.

Let us be known for the love and grace we show the world and ourselves as we make our way through a pandemic.

Pastoral Message regarding the WI Supreme Court Safer at Home Ruling from Six Bishops

Dear friends in Christ.

On May 13, 2020, the Wisconsin Supreme Court lifted the Wisconsin Department of Health Services' Safer at Home extension. However, nothing has changed in our level of concern about contracting and spreading the coronavirus via worship and other gatherings in our churches.

The court decision was based on a contested legal point, and not on any change of the need for caution and safety that the pandemic has brought upon us. Counsel from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, a wide range of additional medical experts, the ELCA's guidelines, and other government entities continue to stress the need for restricting all gatherings to under ten people and attendant safeguards such as distancing, masks, etc.

In the midst of confusion after the court's ruling, we ask that you remain steadfast in taking precautions to not contract or spread the virus. Please follow the counsel and recommendations stated in the May 12, 2020 ELCA document, Considerations for Returning to In-person Worship.

We in the Church need to continue to be guided by scripture, our theology, and the best scientific knowledge we can gather. We stand in unity to prioritize the safety and the well-being of all of our members as we continue in community.

## LUTHERANS, STAY THE COURSE

YESTERDAY THE WISCONSIN Supreme Court made a ruling about the authority of a nonelected government

official. Because of their ruling the existing Safer at Home order was no longer enforceable. That discussion is about laws and good order—it is not the discussion on this page.

The Badger Bounce Back plan remains Wisconsin's guide for incorporating our lives into the COVID-19 world. It provides a step by step process of reopening in light of progress made in fighting the disease. It is based on the federal plan. This process is supported by myself as the Bishop of the La Crosse Area Synod as well as the five other Wisconsin synod bishops who serve the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. And it is supported by the Wisconsin Council of Churches

I am thankful the BBB enables us as Christians to live out our calling to love God and to love our neighbors.

For now, we keep our buildings closed to corporate worship.
Unfortunately Lutheran services are filled with ways to spread a pandemic.
Viruses are shared in warm hand shakes and hugs as we greet and pass the peace. The virus count increases as we spend extended time together in an enclosed space, singing loudly and sharing bread and wine. For now, we won't gather. We don't know who carries the virus. We don't know who is most at risk to exposure. We wait.

Fortunately, we know that Lutherans can worship anywhere. We open our Bibles at home, pray as we drift off to sleep at night, worship together online

We miss worshipping together. But we stay the course. It's how we serve. It's how we care. It's for our God and for our neighbors' sake.

as our pastors become gifted televangelists.

Of course, we still collect offerings. Christians have a need to give. It is marvelous that many mail checks to church and engage in online giving. It is marvelous that we contribute to local groups serving those in special need. And it is inspiring to see God's people offering themselves to distribute food, coordinate blood drives, make phone connections with those who live alone and more and more and more—loving Jesus by loving our neighbors.

Now, as more and more people return to work, it is inspiring to see faithful people serve Jesus by protecting those around them. Masks are worn. Personal distancing is maintained. And in so doing, the neighbor is loved.

We miss worshipping together. But we stay the course. It's how we serve. It's how we care. It's for our God and for our neighbors' sake.



#### FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT







AS MEMBERS OF First Lutheran Church and through our financial gifts we commit to bringing people into a relationship

with Jesus Christ. Through our unique place in our community and the size of our congregation, we are able reach out to people of all ages to make more disciples of Christ. During this pandemic, we have not been able to gather in person as a congregation. With great speed, a dedicated team allowed us to not miss a Wednesday or Sunday service by assembling the people and technology to stream live services directly into our homes. We owe a great deal of thanks to musicians, singers, pastors and the technology team for providing us with an uplifting experience every week. We also need to thank everyone who recorded prayers, readings and faith alive stories to make the experience more meaningful. Thank you to everyone for your support of the streaming ministry through your monthly giving.

Great news! In April giving to the general fund exceed budget by 28%. Even better news, it has reduced our vear-to-date budgeted revenue deficit (through end of April) to only -\$3,884.56. A meaningful part of this good news is that 41 members have switched to electronic giving since the first of the year. Now is an excellent time to consider taking advantage of Simply Giving to ensure our many programs can Change more Lives. We have found streaming services and the pastors' musings are reaching many people in need of comfort during these times. Small groups are reaching people confined at home through Zoom. Regular giving via Simply Giving can provide the resources to make this a permanent part of our reach to Change Lives. We can achieve this objective this year with an additional \$25,000. If you are already participating in Simply Giving, thank vou, and please consider an increase to help make this video ministry happen. If you are not a Simple Giver, now is a great time to join all the

Capital campaign update: It is great to report we have received over 84.5% of the pledged income for the capital campaign. Work on the sanctuary roof has begun. We are also aiming to replace the educational wing flooring and pay off the mortgage. Both of these can be accomplished as we look forward to all pledges being paid in full this year plus an additional \$100K being raised. Thank you for continuing to meet your pledge and considering an extra gift. Full financial details are available by request in the church office. In normal times, we welcome everyone to attend a finance committee meeting. We meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon. The Stewardship Committee meets once a month and is looking for members. For meeting times, contact Pastor Stanton.

### FINDING REST



I HAVE THIS very large over stuffed chair in my living room where I sit in to spend time with God. I either curl up into it or drape my legs over the

arm of the chair, and that's where I'm at peace. It's where I can pray my heart out, but also where I can hear music play as I do my Bible study. I also have a place away from home where I can find peace and where I'm met with God's creative work. That place is my nephew's vineyard atop a ridge in Vernon County that overlooks the farms and ridges with a 180 degree view. I can sit on the deck looking out and seeing all that God has created. It is there that I find peace and rest.

These last few month of being home and not meeting with my Bible study friends, church staff, or getting coffee with a friend catching up with each other has been hard. We've had Zoom meetings, we've talked over the phone and even talked being 6-10 feet apart, but that just isn't enough. The human contact of hugging, touching a shoulder, holding a hand, or resting vour head on someone's shoulder has become so important to me. I so miss the gathering of people who care about one another, being able to share our burdens and our joys not only in words but in the active touch of being human. I must admit that I've grown weary of not being able to worship with others, welcome people into worship and to enjoy fellowship with one another.

The only thing that has sustained me over the last few months is knowing that this time of separation will not last forever. We'll be gradually gathering together, first in small groups and larger and larger as the time goes

on. During this time, I will rest in God's promises as Matthew 11:28 says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest." So I go to God in prayer and petitions and also in thanksgiving for all that he has provided for me during this time.

In God's goodness he sends me little bits of encouragement, like when a friend calls me, or when I get a text message from my daughters. These things energize me to continue to do what is right. We are called to do what is good and right and not grow weary in doing it, as II Thessalonians 3:13 says, "Brothers and sister do not be weary in doing what is right." God gives what each of us needs to continue, for it has been good and right for us to stay at home, protecting our elders and those who are vulnerable.

I hope you have a place in your home where you find time to be with God and a place somewhere else that refreshes your soul. Since we haven't been able to go to the vineyard, I have been closing my eyes and imagining that I am there, sitting at a small table, with a glass of wine, a cool breeze blowing over me making me feel just right. I breathe in the fresh air finding rest, thanking God for his creation and being able to enjoy it.

#### **DEMENTIA FRIENDLY COMMUNITY**



STARTING LAST WINTER a group of faith leaders joined with the La Crosse County Aging and Disability Resource Center, ADRC, to

learn about dementia in our community and discuss ways churches and other faith groups could support people with dementia and their caregivers both in worship and in the community.

You may recall that First Lutheran had committed to host a Memory Cafe in our narthex in March and June of 2020. Unfortunately, those events had to be cancelled due to the pandemic. Once there is a vaccine available, or another more clear way ahead to keep the more vulnerable safe in groups, we will plan to host a Memory Cafe again.

The faith leaders also identified the need for dementia respite for people with early to moderate dementia symptoms. After investigation of similar programs in other communities, the team put together a plan to start Oasis Dementia Respite. Oasis will open fall of 2020 to be offered on Monday and Thursday 11:30am-3:30pm. Oasis will offer lunch, refreshments and therapeutic enrichment activities encompassing the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual sides of a person. People living with dementia often feel overwhelmingly isolated causing feelings of depression over loss of identity and control in their life. Social connections, mental stimulation and physical activity are vital to maintaining functional ability and emotional health.

The program will be hosted at First Free Church, Onalaska at no cost. The space is barrier free, handicap accessible and offers a kitchenette for our use. It would be staffed by trained volunteers, a Certified Nursing Assistant and managed through Causeway Caregivers, a nonprofit that People living with dementia often feel isolated causing feelings of depression. Social connections, mental stimulation and physical activity are vital.

provides other dementia-related programs. The respite will be offered at no cost, or suggested donation, so that all who want to participate, can. The group is still working on funding through grants to cover the paid staff positions and some other equipment and administrative costs. If you are interested in learning more about the program for someone you know who may want to attend the respite program, or if you want to volunteer, contact bridget@firstlu.org.

If you are interested in becoming involved, but volunteering at Oasis isn't what you had in mind, there is a Dementia Friendly Community Coalition that is putting together subcommittees to work on community awareness, engaging health care, dementia friendly business, law enforcement and legal advocacy and caregiver advocacy and support. Ever wanted to read the whole Bible?

Pastor Stanton will lead a year long, 5 days-a-week journey starting June 8!

For years, I wanted to lead a Bible study with people of all ages, genders and Bible study experience. But there was no good day of the week or time of day to meet. So instead of a weekly study at the church... I want to bring a daily Bible study into your internet machine. I'll post a 3-5 minute video by 5am Monday through Friday on Facebook and Youtube. If social media isn't your thing, I could also e-mail each day's video. Send me a request.

By this time next year... we will have read through the whole Bible, having read for about 15 minutes a day. Those are a must if any of us are going to succeed.

This study will be appropriate for ANYone who can read, from kids in 3rd grade to our eldest friend; members and acquaintances far far away.

Use whatever Bible you'd like.


