#### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON**



AMONG AMERICA'S FOUNDERS, Alexander Hamilton was his generation's foremost financial mind. To help

launch the new nation, he believed each state and individual citizens should invest in the federal project by servicing a shared debt. Hamilton said, "A national debt, if it is not excessive, will be to us a national blessing." How could debt be a blessing? For one, Hamilton believed the states would thrive more if they were members of a stronger union, rather than such a loose confederation. United, the fledgling nation could better defend itself, build infrastructure and send products to market sooner. A national debt would be a national project where everyone shares an interest in seeing it paid.

Churches have shared this perspective for decades. The idea is

that keeping debt on the books keeps members financially engaged. Many churches, once they are close to paying off their debt, believe the time has come to borrow again for the next big project. The fear is that once all debts are cleared, members will think they no longer need to support their church.

Things have changed over the last few decades, though, in the minds of many church-goers. 21st century congregations do not seek to exist for their own sake to the extent that they used to. Yes, churches still want a top notch staff, a robust set of programs, beautiful buildings and spacious, convenient parking lots. Of course. But 21st century Christians view these pieces as foundational building blocks. We want to be more than our facilities and what happens there. Building and

maintaining "First Lutheran, Onalaska" is not our members' end game. Our church buildings, our programs and even our worship services are meant to serve a mission that goes far beyond 410 Main Street.

Debt used to unite church members in a shared project that created a religious club. In 2020, though, debt is seen by many as an obstacle as we want every dollar possible to serve our own church and support our community, both near and far. First Lutheran has matured over these first 150 years into a congregation who seeks to proclaim God's love by

serving our neighbors with our time, attention and financial support.

On November 22, First Lutheran will celebrate the complete payment of all our debts. We will burn our mortgage during worship! For the first time in living memory, our congregation will not be united by servicing a debt together. Our generosity can now focus outward into our community more than ever before.

The old theory would suggest that our giving may go down in 2021 because we no longer share a debt that requires payment. I believe that just the opposite will happen. Giving will increase because First Lutheran is

directing our proclamation into a world that needs us. Thank you for the sacrifices you made to help pay off our debt. And thank you in advance for the sacrifices you intend to keep offering so that together, we support families, institutions and ministries that proclaim God's grace in a broken world.

#### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN**



IT'S NOVEMBER. I don't know why that feels momentous, but then again, every new month feels like we have made it

through the latest obstacle and are one step closer to the end—of what I am not sure, but that is how it is feeling to me. It's November. We made it.

Of course, November brings an election. An important one. Voting has always been, for me, the most concrete way I participate in our democracy. I remember growing up, sitting with my parents at the dining room table, listening to them talk through the issues and the candidates before going to the polls. Then, when I was old enough. I would join in on the conversation and take my place in the line to cast my vote. Of course, we would see all our neighbors there in the gym of the middle school down the street, kids playing outside or in a corner of the room and so voting felt like all of us coming together to make sure our voices were heard. Voting has always been my sacred duty as a

citizen of this country. It is strange to me not to going to the polls on November 3, to experience the sense of community voting together brings, but this hasn't been a year for usual community building activities.

What I have found this year, especially as we approach November 3, is a deeper pull, a deeper call, to trust God more than ever. It is hard to put into words, but it feels like the Holy Spirit is pushing beyond my preconceived notions of what it means to fear, love and trust God above all things to move me into a deeper and more profound relationship with God for the sake of the world. It has certainly been challenging and by no means something only I have been feeling.

We invite you to be in prayer the whole of the day and to join us in this day of prayer as our country decides on leadership. As we do so, may we always remember that it is in God that we put our trust.





DEAR FRIENDS IN the La Crosse Area Synod: We are living in interesting times. I am glad I have been sharing them with

you. It is empowering and hopeful to witness what Christ is doing through us as congregations and as synod in the midst of this pandemic. You continue to ensure that the Word of God is proclaimed to our members, to our neighbors and to the world. You continue to feed the hungry, connect with the lonely, protect the most vulnerable among us, and witness for justice. Thank you for what you do in the name of Jesus.

It is my honor to continue to serve with you beyond my two terms in office. I appreciate the opportunity to be a part of our transition to ministry in an epidemic and divided world. I am thankful that I can aim us toward ministry together with our next called bishop. But it is now time for a change.

Since we began postponing and finally cancelled the 2020 La Crosse Area Synod Assembly, I have been discerning with family, friends, colleagues, and our Presiding Bishop. I have prayed. Through much wise council and with a sense of peace I am announcing that I will retire as Bishop of the La Crosse Area and as a called pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on December 31. 2020. I choose to do so for the wellbeing of the synod and for my health and life as husband, father, grandfather, and one with enough years to follow some wisdom.

Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has already begun a search for an interim bishop to serve starting January 1, 2021, until a newly elected bishop can be installed. I will be available to

the interim bishop for consultation. Between now and December 31, I will continue my bishop's duties with full focus and will begin guiding the synod's work toward the transitions to come. Thank you for your partnership over the past twelve years. Thank you for understanding it is my time to retire. Thank you for your prayers for Lynn's and my future.



#### FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT





AS MEMBERS OF First Lutheran Church and through our financial gifts, we commit to bringing people into a relationship

with Jesus Christ. Through our unique place in our community and the size of our congregation, we are able reach out to people of all ages to make more disciples of Christ. November is traditionally World Hunger month in the ELCA. Working with and through congregations like First Lutheran, ELCA World Hunger is uniquely positioned to reach communities in need. From health clinics to micro loans, water wells to animal husbandry, community meals to advocacy, your gifts to ELCA World Hunger make it possible for the ELCA to respond, supporting sustainable solutions that get at the root causes of hunger and poverty. We normally take a special offering for World Hunger during our services. To support ELCA World Hunger this year please contribute directly on their

website at elca.org/hunger/donate or send contributions to the church office designated for ELCA World Hunger.

General Fund giving for operations (not including the capital campaign and preschool) as of Sept. 30, 2020 was \$433,527. Budgeted receipts were \$441,843 leaving a deficit of (\$8,316). Thanks to everyone's generosity, we have reduced the deficit by over \$10,000 since August. That helps put us on track to end the year without a deficit with your continued support. Please consider regular giving via Simply Giving to meet this goal and provide the resources to expand our ministry to Change Lives. If you are already participating in Simply Giving, thank you. Capital Campaign update: We are going to **BURN THE MORTGAGE** at a special event during the services on Sunday, Nov. 22. Do not miss this date we have been looking forward to for some time. It is also great to report we

are approaching the receipt of \$1,000,000 of the pledged income for the capital campaign to date. In addition, we have already received declarations of intent of over \$180.000 toward our Above and Beyond finish of the Capital Campaign, which has a goal of \$230,000.
