MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



MY FAMILY IS going to increase our giving to First Lutheran's General Fund in 2021. For three years we have made two separate monthly gifts to our church: \$870 per month to support the General Fund and \$100 per month to support the "Our Church + Our Time" capital campaign. We are fortunate enough to not need that \$100 to come back into our family's monthly spending budget. So, we will be increasing our General Fund gift to \$970 per month.

Why am I telling you this? For two reasons: 1) Because too many of us consider money to be a forbidden topic of conversation, which gives money a certain power over all of us. For some, talking about their wealth feels almost as vulnerable as talking about sex or a long held secret that makes them feel

guilty. Money and possessions, though, are spoken of in Scripture more than 800 times. As your pastor, I am called to talk about money with you. "To those whom much is given, much is expected." And I know, many of us have been given much! 2) I want you to consider joining my family and me—if you have been as fortunate as we have—in substantially increasing your gift to First Lutheran's General Fund in 2021. Perhaps that means you carry over at least some of what you were regularly gifting for the capital campaign. Or you may choose to increase by a dollar a day. I trust you'll know what works for your budget.

In February, we will vote on a budget at our annual meeting that no longer needs to include mortgage

payments! Hallelujah! It will be an ambitious budget that meets the moment, but also prepares our church for a brighter and younger future. I want to hire a Faith Formation Director in the second half of 2021, when—we hope in person meetings and events will be 'normal' again. This full time staff position will attend primarily to our kids and their families, but will also serve singles, elders and everyone else through special events, learning opportunities and lots of Christian FUN. Since becoming Senior Pastor here in 2011, we have had a difficult time financially supporting a staff that includes a position like this. It is time for us to get over that hump! And 2021 is the year to do it.

First Lutheran is poised to grow in every way, especially among the youth and young families of Onalaska. We

have a unique, genuine and powerful message of grace that young people hear almost NOwhere else! The entire Onalaska community could be strengthened through our church and our authentic message that "All Are Welcome." To fulfill this ambitious vision, I will be folding my 2018-2020 capital campaign giving into my 2021 offerings. I invite you to prayerfully consider joining me.

am deeply struck by his

characterization of Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 13, "and now faith, hope and love abide... and the greatest of these is love." Bishop Curry says: To live full lives, together, we need faith, hope and love—but of these, love is the most important. Faith is another word for trust. Faith dares us to believe that in the end, love wins. We can't see it, but we believe it anyway. Then hope

comes along and puts wind in our sails of faith. Hope is the energy that keeps us going when the gravity of reality would otherwise defeat us. But while faith and hope are necessary for a full life, they're not a quide for life. They don't tell you what to do. That's love's job. Love tells you how to direct the energy of outrageous faith. If hope and faith are the wind and sails, love is the rudder. It's God's GPS.

I don't know about you, but hope seems to be a light breeze of late. Or perhaps my sails of faith haven't been trimmed quite right. Either way, it seems to me that it is in short supply. Yet, faith and love would tell me that hope is there for those who love Jesus, who gather together (whatever that may look like) to love and support one another and in that hope is born and fear and despair is kept at bay. Love, the act of loving each other and loving God give us the hope we need.

As we enter a new church year, we will be reminded again and again that love has come. A love that changed the world, a love that has the power to change our world. A love that pulls us out of ourselves and into service for others. This year, more than ever, the words of the carol sing the promise that we all so desperately need: Love has come and never will leave us! Love is life everlasting and free. Love is Jesus within and among us. Love is the peace our hearts are seeking. Love! Love! Love is the gift of Christmas. Love! Love! Praise to you, God on high!



Starting Jan. 18, for 21 days you will be invited to either watch a short video, or listen to a podcast, or read an article and reflect. 

FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT



WITH OUR NEW status as a debt-free congregation, we now bring total focus on bringing people into a relationship with Jesus

Christ. This Changes Lives! In the month of January, we will hold our 2021 Annual Stewardship Campaign to Change Lives. This campaign will focus on increasing giving so we can financially support 3 very important initiatives to Change Lives. The 3 initiatives are Pandemic Relief for Sugar Creek Bible Camp, creating a fund to Grow Participation in Faith Events and hiring a Faith Formation Director. During each week in January, every member will receive multiple communications explaining each of these initiatives. Thank you in advance for reading them. These initiatives will be highly

successful when we increase our general-fund giving. As you learn about them in the coming weeks, please prayerfully consider continuing a portion of the contribution you have made to the capital campaign. The objective is to increase total general fund giving by \$60,000 for these three life-changing initiatives

General fund update: Giving for operations (not including the capital campaign and preschool) as of Oct. 31, 2020 was \$473,255. Budgeted receipts were \$485,962 leaving a deficit of \$12,707. With continued generosity in December, we can finish the year without a deficit. Please consider regular giving via Simply Giving to meet this goal and provide the resources to expand our ministry to Change Lives. If you are already participating in Simply Giving, thank you. Capital campaign update: It is also great to report we are approaching the receipt of \$1,000,000 of the pledged income for the capital campaign to date. In addition, we have already received declarations of intent and contributions of close to \$200.000 toward our Above and Beyond finish of the capital campaign, which has a goal of \$230,000. Thank you to everyone who has already declared their intent. Thank you to everyone who has generously given and committed to both the original campaign and Above and Beyond. We anticipate receipt of all funds from both campaigns by the end of the year. Full financial details are available by request in the church office. In normal times, we welcome everyone to attend a finance committee meeting. We meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon. The Stewardship Committee meets once a month and is looking for members. For meeting times and Zoom information, contact Pastor Stanton...
