#### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON**



I'VE BEEN ON more than a few road trips in my life. As a kid, I remember driving from northern Illinois to Orlando. For my Youth

Gathering, it was a 24-hour drive from Medford, WI, to New Orleans. A few years ago, I led our family on the well-worn path from our area to Yellowstone and back.

Of the 35 hours in the car for that round trip to Yellowstone and back, do you know what hour was the worst for me? The same hour that was the worst in every other road trip I have ever taken: the last one. Anticipation and excitement grow with every hour that passes as we make our way to our destination. Along our return, there may still be a couple new things to see or do. But by the end of the journey, in that last hour, all anybody wants to do

is GET THERE already. There is no slower hour of a big road trip than the last one.

Being separated from each other as we remain church at home, we could metaphorically divide COVID-time into 'hours' of a road trip. Not that any of it was something I've ever looked forward to! My bucket list never included, "Christmas Eve parking lot worship." But leading a church through COVID-time has felt like a long, hard trek. And, I think the worst 'hour' is now upon us: the last one.

It seems that the month of March is when a lot of us, especially our most vulnerable, will be vaccinated against COVID-19. Our COVID Advisory Panel feels very hopeful that the time truly is approaching when our church can

#### **MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN**



I WAS SAD going into Ash Wednesday, missing you all and missing the rituals of the day whose meaning is made stronger by your

presence. It was so strange, even after 11 months, to stand staring at empty pews just beyond the camera. I was sad going to sleep on Ash Wednesday, happy to have seen some of you in person, but it still wasn't quite right.

A friend of mine recently reflected on a Lenten season after a year of Lent. Which this past year has been, really. A year of fasting, a year of life in a minor key, a year where little has felt normal, life during a pandemic is a life lived never quite knowing what the next day will bring. Even with most of us settling into new routines, it seems like just when we get the hang of that new routine, we find ourselves having to adjust once again because there is new

information to be had. I find myself quite resistant to a "normal" Lent this year. I am not fasting from anything, and I am not "adding" something. This past year has done enough of both of those to last for a while. What my heart desires the most is to rest, to rest in God, to trust in God more deeply so that, in my sadness or my quasiroutined life, or my tiredness, or my joy in creating, or my amazement at the animals that walk past my window, I know peace. So I will rest this Lent, I will rest in God's grace as I pray and as I read, I will rest in God's grace as I listen and as I speak. I will rest in God's grace as I work and as I play. I will rest. And in the resting, I suspect I will see God more clearly and the Holy Spirit will show up to stir my heart with reminders of Jesus' words and actions.

begin reopening safely. Our Peer Ministry group, confirmation and some other small groups will begin to meet in person, indoors in March. The 'last hour' before we start worshipping together again inside our beautiful sanctuary is upon us. It promises to feel especially LONG.

Easter is April 4. Spring is right around the corner. Our patience is always thin this time of year. This year, though, is special. Here's my pastoral suggestion: engage in Lent. Use this month of March to go deep. Go deep into your feelings of frustration and anxiety, also noticing your hope and gratitude. It has been a really long 12 months. But the dawn seems to be coming. And in the midst of our impatience, God is still present among us, sustaining us in surprising but real ways. Worship with us each Wednesday at 6:15, either in our parking lot or online. Worship with us Sundays, either online at 8:00 or in the lot at 10:30. Read the "Again & Again" daily devotional. Pray daily. Journal your prayers with God. Whatever connects with you, do it! Spend less time away from God's mercy and return to the good news that you are not alone; that you do not have to save the world yourself; that you do not have to be God, because God is God for you. What a relief.

I encourage you to finish this pandemic strong! Because, on the other side of it, our church will live into a New Creation... again. I am actually kind of excited for that!

To take a word and allow it to shape conversation with my family so that together we can ponder what God is doing. Throughout it all is woven a giving over, a bending and a deep desire to rest in whatever God reveals.

Perhaps as we continue to journey toward Easter, you would consider that after this year of Lent, God is inviting you into a time of rest from what is burdening you so that you may find peace.

#### FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT

WITH OUR NEW status as a debt-free congregation, we now bring total focus on bringing people into a relationship with Jesus

Christ. This Changes Lives! In the month of January, we held our 2021 Annual Stewardship Campaign to Change Lives through Faith Formation. This campaign focused on increasing giving so we can financially support three very important initiatives to Change Lives. The three initiatives are pandemic relief for Sugar Creek Bible Camp (\$25K), lowering the cost of faith events (\$10K) and hiring a Faith Formation Director (\$25K). Thank you for reviewing the videos and mailings sent out. These initiatives will be highly successful with increased giving to our general fund. By Sunday, Feb. 21 we

have received over 125 statements of intent with increases totaling \$50,000! If you have already indicated your intent to increase giving, thank you. If you are still contemplating an increase, please prayerfully consider continuing all or a portion of the contribution you have made to the capital campaign. Please declare your intent to increase online or return the statement of intent card you received in the mail. With only \$10K more of intent to be received, we are excited by the prospect of the Lives we can Change by meeting our goal.

General fund update: Giving for operations (not including the capital campaign and preschool) for January was \$63,618. If we divide the year's budget into twelve equal parts, that means January's revenue points to another year when we'll meet our

revenue budget. For comparison, in January of 2020, we received \$35,627 over four Sundays. January 2021 had 5 Sundays. Even with the discrepancy in Sundays, 2021 is beginning stronger than 2020. Thank you to everyone for your continued generosity. Please consider regular giving via Simply Giving to provide the resources to expand our ministry to Change Lives. If you are already participating in Simply Giving, thank you. To enroll, call the church office or sign up at .

Capital campaign update: It is also great to report we have received \$1,148,000 of the pledged income for the "Our Church + Our Time" capital campaign and the "Above & Beyond" appeal. Contributions are still coming in. Thank you to everyone who has already completed their pledge. We are looking forward to receiving the remaining pledges to complete the asbestos abatement in the educational wing, purchase the bus and build a sign. Full financial details are available by request in the church office. In normal times, we welcome everyone to attend a finance committee meeting We meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon. The Stewardship Committee meets monthly and is looking for members. For meeting times and Zoom information, contact Pastor Stanton.

#### **FOUNDATION COMMITTEE UPDATE**



THE FIRST LUTHERAN

community and also those
that are part of First

Lutheran Church's own mission outreach. Included in the latter category is the First Teen Clothes Closet, which was established in 2012 as both a mission to serve youth in need in our community and as a volunteer opportunity for the youth in our congregation.

Located in Trinity Lutheran Church in La Crosse, where the Closet can provide a "one-stop shop" alongside Trinity's Children's Clothes Closet, food pantry and Monday night meal ministry, the First Teen Clothes Closet provides clothing, shoes, accessories and toiletries for pre-teens and teens in the greater La Crosse community at no cost. It is staffed and led entirely by volunteers who collect, sort and teen-approve gently-used clothing donations, shop for needed new items (such as undergarments) and toiletries, and host open-shopping nights and private appointments. The Closet is funded almost entirely through grants from a variety of community organizations and the First Lutheran Foundation Fund is blessed to be one of those grant providers.

Our foundation provided funds in 2020 to continue the Closet's annual effort to provide teens with new athletic shoes, suitable for gym classes, before the beginning of each school year, in cooperation with a similar effort by the Children's Closet. Though this last year prevented the traditional block party and shoe distribution event, the Teen Closet still provided more than 60 pairs of new shoes to teens

through outreach to the Boys and Girls Clubs in La Crosse and individual appointments at the Closet. The year before, this project distributed nearly 150 pairs of new shoes to teens in need.

There is little doubt the need remains as high or higher as it was prior to the pandemic.

While the Closet did close for three months at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, it has been accepting private appointments since June 2020 and is looking forward to the time when it is again safe to restore the Monday night open shopping hours to all teens in need. In 2019, the Closet served more than 250 unique individuals, many of whom visited the Closet seasonally. While the numbers in 2020 dropped to only 62 different quests due to the closure and changes in how shopping opportunities are hosted. there is little doubt the need remains as high or higher as it was prior to the pandemic.

The generous gifts of our past and present members have allowed for grants to be made to mission efforts like the First Teen Clothes Closet, reaching out to serve as the hands and feet of Christ in our community. 

OLDER WISER LUTHERANS

It may have been cold outside but that didn't keep the OWLs from hooting in February.
