MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



BELOW/ARE THE comments I made Mar. 14 as worship began indoors, in-person for the first time in a year. A number of people asked if I'd share them in print.

Thank God for the newsletter!

MARCH 14, 2021:

52 Sundays ago, exactly a year ago tomorrow, we were among the first church families in the area to cancel worship in response to COVID-19. It was a difficult decision.

Each and every week since then has presented information, data and opinions that have continued to make our weekly decision to worship safely at home difficult.

Being Church is *difficult* in normal times! It's not the same as being a business. It's not the same as being a school. The Church does not exist to make a profit. And we serve all ages and stages of life. The church exists to give glory to God.

Now, being Lutheran, when you hear that... you should ask, "What does that mean?" What does it mean to "give alory to God?"

Of course, each congregation answers that question for itself. There is no ONE answer. Thanks be to God! There are *many* ways to "give glory to God." In 2020, since March 15, we have answered that question by BEING the Church... while remaining away from our church building. And it has been difficult.

Today our family of faith continues to answer the question, "How shall we give glory to God"... but with a different

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN



"I CAN'T WAIT for Faster!" I have heard some form of this comment from several corners of my world. This deep need for

the resurrection story. It feels as if the world has been in the tomb and resurrection day is nearly here. I too feel it in myself, in my body, this need for the resurrection story. Some days it feels like my bones are jumping around, eager to be free of their confinement, or maybe that is my spirit longing for days when being free felt differently.

In a year long Lent, longing for Easter becomes a daily cry. Yet, what I am finding in this year of Lent, this year of isolation and restriction, is an invitation that I could not have heard in the time of Easter. There is something about the forced simplicity of pandemic life that bids me to slow down, to seek silence, to find hope and joy in different ways. Which, friends, is not my preferred mode of being. I am an out loud, joy full, gatherer of people, explorer of the world, learning new things, colorful kind of person. Isolation, sadness and gray days is the exact opposite of where I typically live and yet, here we are. My soul longing for Easter and yet bidding me to stay here in Lent just a little longer, because just like a tulip that needs the darkness of a winter's earth to bloom, we need gray to help us see the color of life.

Ścience has been reminding us of this for eons—the light and the dark, the sadness and the joy, the heights and depths are what give life its essence. It is what makes life worth living, but if we ignore one, the other loses its power as well. The same can be said for Lent and Easter. For a time

answer. Our COVID Advisory Panel recommended to the Vision & Leadership Team that we begin offering worship in three ways: continue providing a livestream option, offer outdoor worship services for in person worship whenever we can... and offer indoor, in-person worship.

Why? There are three things that have made this possible: 1) Community spread is decreasing. 2) vaccinations are increasing and 3) the congregation is willing to take the necessary precautions to be safe in person.

I've already heard from a couple siblings in this family of faith that they won't be here until we drop some of these restrictions and precautions, because they are too much. I've also heard from a couple siblings who have told me we are being careless to gather again in person. Like I said, being a church is difficult. BUT, despite the ongoing challenges of this moment, we are going to remain First Lutheran **together.** Whether we are here, home, in our cars, or on 5th Ave., we will keep Faith Alive! at First Lutheran. **And we will offer each other grace for decisions we each make.** Because we are One in the Spirit. We are One in the Lord. And if any of us ever thought that was just something we say... this moment is proving the truth of that claim.

Thank you for being One in the Spirit with me... and with your church."

Gathering again in person, indoors has been great because it's been so fun to see people while also being awful because not everyone can come. It admits how different a place many of us are at as compared to others. Maybe you are immuno-compromised, unvaccinated or have another reason for not feeling safe at worship, while others have decided to return. For a pastor who celebrates the unity we experience through Christian community, this part is hard.

And that's why I keep returning to that song, "We are One in the Spirit. We are One in the Lord." That means that even now, amidst our scattered siblings who are worshipping in three different ways, even now we are One. I pray that encourages us all.

God's love has been poured into our hearts, and that love makes it possible to endure suffering, which ultimately helps us to grow stronger. of pandemic and a time of wellness. Ignore one and the other loses its power as well.

So what to do with the weeks before an Easter that seems like it has taken too long to come? How to honor the grayness, the sadness, the hardship of this moment without jumping too quickly to brightness, the joy, the relief of the next? I'm not sure, to be honest. I have not gone through something like this before, although life hasn't been perfectly blissful, to be sure. What I do know is that my task right now is to be attentive to what this moment is, and I am brought right back to verses from Romans 5 that I spoke to me about 3 months into the pandemic: "1Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. 3And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces

endurance, 4and endurance produces character and character produces hope, 5and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

God's love has been poured into our hearts, and that love makes it possible to endure suffering, which ultimately helps us to grow stronger. It is this realization that bids me to slow down in these last days of Lent, in these (hopefully) last months of the pandemic and remember not only God's love for me, but what that love calls me to again and again, which Paul so helpfully outlines in Romans 12.

Friends, Easter is coming, that is for sure, and we will rejoice, but for now we sit and we pray and we give thanks to God for a love that knows no end.

WITH OUR NEW status as a debt free congregation, we now bring total focus on bringing people into a relationship with Jesus

Christ. This Changes Lives! We are changing lives in our own congregation with the much-awaited return to in person worship. This would not be possible without all the volunteers who show up weekly to make it happen. Each service requires two people to check people in, a greeter to restock communion cups and give out children's bags and four ushers to safely direct people in and out of the sanctuary. Plus, others who assist with cleaning. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered so we can worship together once again. With Holy Week coming, more people are needed. If

General fund update: Giving for operations (not including the capital campaign and preschool) for February was \$62,639. If we divide the year's budget into twelve equal parts, that means that through February, we are slightly ahead of budget. For comparison, through February of 2020, we were behind our budget by nearly \$25,000. Thank you to everyone who completed a statement of intent to increase giving during the January Stewardship Drive. We have received over 120 statements of intent with increases totaling over \$50,000. Please consider regular giving via Simply Giving to provide the resources to expand our ministry to Change Lives. If you are already participating in

Simply Giving, thank you. To enroll sign up at 1stlu.org/giving or call the church office.

Capital Campaign update: It is also great to report we have received \$1,154,465 of the pledged income for the capital campaign and Above and Beyond. Contributions are still coming in. There are \$95,000 in pledges that remain to be filled. Thank you to everyone who has already completed their pledge. We are looking forward to receiving the remaining pledges to complete the asbestos abatement in the educational wing, purchase the bus and build a sign. Full financial details are available by request in the church office. In normal times, we welcome everyone to attend a finance committee meeting. We meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon. The Stewardship Committee meets monthly and is looking for members. For meeting times and Zoom information, contact Pastor Stanton.

Lutheran Church. One such worthy and deserving organization is the Sugar Creek Bible Camp. The FLC Foundation has provided funds to Sugar Creek for many years, which are in addition to the current initiative for relief related to the COVID pandemic.

Sugar Creek Bible Camp is a year-round camp and retreat center affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. It is situated on 661 acres in the bluffs and coulees of beautiful southwestern Wisconsin. There are programs for all grade levels from Kindergarten through confirmation and high school as well as adult retreats. Sugar Creek offers a variety of activities including: pony and horseback rides, wagon rides, swimming, camping, hiking, canoeing, campfires, singalongs and games that incorporate worship and Bible studies. They also have a disc golf course, sauna

and miles of hiking/biking trails! The camp also offers team-building activities on low-ropes challenge courses, which are perfect for church groups, school groups, or even corporate retreats.

Sugar Creek is open all seasons to all ages. They have year-round retreat spaces for family, school, church groups, or specialty retreats. They can accommodate groups of more than 100 for overnight retreats and even more for day events.

Sugar Creek's mission statement: Where all generations encounter Christ, experience God's grace and are empowered by the Holy Spirit to go forth in faith.

The generous gifts of our past and present members have allowed for grants to be made to places like Sugar Creek on behalf of First Lutheran Church. 

FAITH BUILDING BLOCKS

Throughout the year, each age group has a special "Faith Building Block" session in which parents or special adults are asked to attend class with their child. Most sessions last for four weeks.
