## MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON LAST BEST CHANCE



HAVE YOU EVER wanted to make a special effort to reconnect with an old friend, a distant family member or an

acquaintance that you've always wanted to know better?

Have I got a deal for you!

Believe it or not, it's been five years since First Lutheran graciously gifted me with time for a sabbatical with my family. You may remember that Carla and I made a dream come true, taking our three kids to Carla's home country, the Bahamas, so that we could all be immersed in Bahamian culture. Carla and the kids spent six full months there. With my three months of sabbatical, I did nearly nothing. It was pretty great. In doing less and being more, I was renewed in my call to ministry and reinvigorated in my call to be husband, parent and friend. That is the goal of a sabbatical, after all. It was a good investment for First Lutheran to make.

In 2022, I plan to take another sabbatical. This time, because of the scheduling challenges of my kids and this season of life, instead of taking three full months away all at once, I will take half in January-February and the other half from Memorial Day until mid-July.

My 2022 sabbatical has a title: "Last, Best Chance." Why? Because I submitted a grant proposal to the Lilly Foundation with ideas all centered around the last, best chances I have right now. They are many! My eldest will be a senior in high school next year. Next summer will be our last, best

friends who are in Virginia and Colorado. And, another mid-winter escape to Arizona to golf with my Dad. The January/February portion of my sabbatical will tend to my most important adult relationships and end with a silent retreat led by a spiritual director.

In the summer portion, I will focus on the relationships I have with my kids and godchildren (I have seven from the two aforementioned best friends). The week after school is dismissed, my family hopes to travel to the United Kingdom so that we can show our kids where we met on a study abroad in 1997 at Harlaxton Manor. Some of vou may know David, my father-in-law, grew up outside Glasgow. For years we have hoped to share time and space there together. Once we return home, we will spend the 4th of July week, as usual with our best friends. What will be unusual is that we will stay in a front row beach house.

I say these things are happening with such confidence because I won the grant! "Lilly" believes in the vision I shared to not only use my sabbatical to capitalize on a bunch of "last, best chances" in my own life, but to encourage my congregation to do the same. And this is where I have a deal FOR YOU, too good to refuse.

As a part of the grant, 20 members of First Lutheran will be given a \$250 micro-grant to cover expenses that help you take a "last, best chance". Do you have an old roommate you've been meaning to visit? Use the \$250 to fly to visit them. Have you ever wanted to 'splurge' on a spa day with your mother-in-law but never felt like you should? Use \$250 to treat yourselves. Want to see Aaron Rodgers play the Vikings one last time in Minneapolis? Use \$250 to take your nephew. I DON'T CARÉ HOW YOU ÚSE THÉ \$250... except 1) it's used for the sake of a relationship in your life (not just on yourself, unless it's for a silent retreat. That would be a great way to use it!) and 2) You'll have to share with me

what happened in your experience. How did God work through the experience? Some will write about their experience, others may be recorded on video; others may want to share their story in-person. The only 'string' attached to the money is your willingness to share your experience however you choose—with me and the whole congregation.

My hope is that First Lutheran gathers 20 stories that can be used by everyone to celebrate the relationships God graces us with every day. Relationships deserve special attention and special events. You think of the 'last, best chance' you want to take and I'll give you \$250.

E-mail me with your idea or stop in or call the office. It's a first come, first served kind of thing. I'm excited to see how God reconnects me with my most important relationships. I'm inviting you to share in the fun.



## **FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT**



WITH OUR NEW status as a debt-free congregation, we now bring total focus on bringing people into a relationship with Jesus Christ. This Changes Lives!

It is the time of year when we start looking forward to how we will Change Lives in 2022. The stewardship team has been hard at work listening to the congregation to identify our focus goals for 2022. With the approval from V&L the Stewardship Campaign for 2022 will take place in January with the goal to increase giving by \$40K. If the increased giving is received, \$10K will be donated to the La Crosse Hunger Task Force, \$10K to the YWCA Homeless Collaborative and \$20K for Faith Formation Ministry, which will go towards paying a full-time faith formation pastor or deacon. You will begin receiving weekly information about the campaign in January, which will end with Stewardship Sunday and the receiving of intent cards on Sunday Jan. 30. Thank you in advance for your prayerful consideration of helping us meet these goals in 2022.

General fund update: Giving for operations (not including the capital campaign and preschool) YTD as of the end of September was \$486,056. That means that through September, we are ahead of budget by \$10,606. Thank you for your continued support. Please consider regular giving via Simply Giving to provide the resources to expand our ministry to Change Lives. If you already participate in Simply Giving, thank you. ## **180 QUILTS ON THEIR WAY**

The quilters group at First Lutheran kept working through the pandemic even though covid restrictions meant they couldn't meet at church for most of the past 12 months. Instead, they worked at home and, when it was safe, they would gather to tie quilts in a church member's basement.

The result: 180 quilts were finished before it was time to give them away.

The quilts were displayed on pews and in the narthex the week of Sept. 26. Thirty of the quilts were sent to Fort McCoy for the Afghan people who are staying there. The rest were boxed up and, on Oct. 9, Ardie Van Riper and Adrian Hagen took them to the Lutheran World Relief collection site for distribution throughout the world.

The quilters resumed meeting at the church in early September, and gather in the Fireside room on Tuesdays at 9am.

Thank you to all who walked and donated to the 3rd annual Coulee Region Hunger Walk. It was warm and sunny on October 10, and 150-200 people from the community participated in-person to walk and run. First Lutheran's very own Jim Knutson entertained us with music while walkers and runners checked in and gathered together with friends, school groups, church members and family. Donations are still coming in, but we hit \$19,000. A big thank you to the First Lutheran Foundation for contributing \$1,000.

The Coulee Region Hunger Walk (CRHW) became an organization in the fall of 2019. It hosted the first event after becoming a recognized nonprofit organization. CRHW organized to support hunger in the local La Crosse Community. 30% of funds raised go to both The Hunger Task Force, which is our local food bank and Wafer, a large local food pantry. The remaining 40% is donor directed and includes local school pantries, the Onalaska Food Pantry and some international organizations such as ELCA World Hunger.




