MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



SINCE FIRST LUTHERAN'S Call Committee formed in May of 2021, we have been excited, disappointed, surprised and anxious to name just a few of the feelings we've processed together. It's been a while since we've provided an update on our search for a Youth & Family minister, so I thought I'd share our current status. It is familiar territory for the Call Committee, at this point.

In January, I will celebrate 15 years since arriving at First Lutheran to serve as Pastor and our financial capacity has finally grown to a level where our Office of Ministry can include a third person. Having a full time, benefited Pastor serve our youth and families will provide expertise along with a true sense of call which hopefully translates into longevity and consistency within

our ministries to young people and their families. Calling a third pastor will also allow for me and Pastor Karyn to attend more fully to adult ministries, caring ministries, visitation, teaching, online content and so much more.

Over the last year and a half, the Synod Office has provided some solid candidates. Pastor Karyn and I have exhausted our own networks. And we have talked to anyone with interest. I have spoken to dozens of pastors about this call and the Call Committee has interviewed four of them. Three of them have had multiple interviews with us, but for a variety of reasons, the 'fit' has not been found.

Wise administrators have told me to 'hire slow', but this feels ridiculous! I'm kidding, of course, as I do not regret

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN



Wider Welcome, Deeper Love

WHAT DOES THIS mean? This is a question that I have gotten a lot in the last couple of months. So often we want solutions, things easily checked off a list but wider welcome, deeper love is not that—it is a way of life that is open and loving to all we encounter. Sometimes that is a brief moment in a drive thru line and other times that is walking with someone for a long period of time. It is also a way of life that is open to changing the ways we speak and the ways we act when we realize that what we are saying or doing causes harm. Which is good news for those of you who want something concrete to do as you begin living your life of wider welcome and deeper love.

A month or so ago I was preaching and as happens often, I went off script. This is usually the Spirit leading me somewhere but sometimes it is me trying to be funny or add some relevant and timely anecdote. That was what happened that day and as soon as the words left my mouth I wanted to grab them back. What did I say, you may ask? Well I was listing things and then I said, "and the LGBTQIA+ issue". Now, I know most of you heard that and didn't think a single thing about it, but I also know what members of the LGBTQIA+ community have shared about being considered "an issue". I don't know about you, but I don't like to think I am ever an issue for anyone because that means I am in trouble or a problem. That is how folks in the community feel every time we say "LGBTQIA+ issue". It isn't a issue for them to be who they

any part of how our Call Committee or the candidates themselves have faithfully served throughout this discernment. But we all wish our new pastor would be presented to us, through the power of the Holy Spirit sooner than later, which is why I'm asking you for your prayers.

Later this month, we have another second interview scheduled with a very strong candidate. This pastor is exceptionally qualified, with great passion for youth ministry and has a story that compliments both Pastor Karyn's and my own. Like most vocations, the pastoral 'labor force supply' is far smaller than demand. So, this candidate has options for where they may land in their next call. Please pray with me that our Call Committee, pastors and staff provide a clear, faithful picture of what life in Onalaska

is like and that our church is trying to grow in every way. I want this candidate to see what God is up to among us as we seek to offer wider welcome and deeper love inside our fellowship and beyond our walls. Pray with me that their time with us in November will provide an irresistible opportunity to answer God's call to serve our church for years to come. Or, another way to pray this prayer is what I've been saying since May 2021, "Thy will be done..."

have been created to be until we as members of the hetero/cis community make it so. This is where wider welcome and deeper love comes in. The issue is with us, so it is up to us to figure out how to be better. That can be as simple as not referring to the ways we are working for justice for the LGBTQIA+ community as "an issue". Instead we can simply say "we are working on finding justice for LGBTQIA+ community". This small change can make a difference, not just in our own thinking and being but in the people who aren't a problem needing to be solved. In that small change, they know a wider welcome and a deeper love because they hear they are a valued member of our church.

Sometimes it feels overwhelming when we realize there is a lot we don't know or realize causes harm. I am in that place often. What I have learned is to listen with love and change my behavior accordingly, even if I don't "get it". It rarely hurts me to make a

small change in my vocabulary or actions and it has a big impact on those around me. And when I mess up, I have learned to apologize and try again, knowing that there is great value in the trying and lots of grace as we make our way forward.

Wider welcome, deeper love is a journey in following Jesus more deeply that we will make together and how we live that out will look differently in you than it does in me, but at the core it is about showing up and showing the love of God to all our neighbors in small ways each day that add up to big, open love.

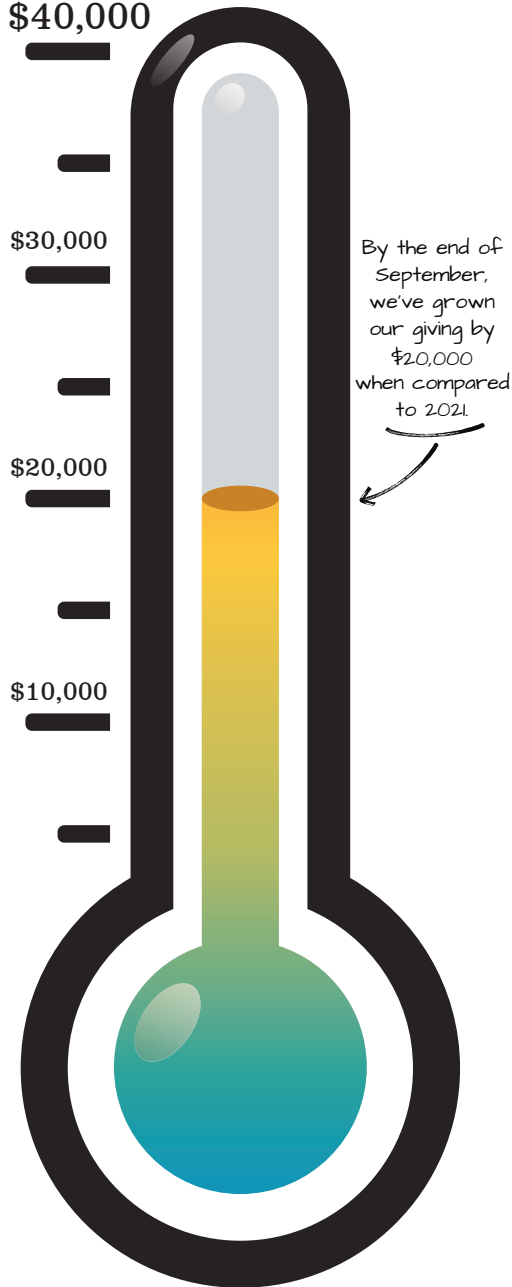

Changes Lives! We have now completed the first 9 months of 2022. Everyone's continued generosity is moving us toward our goal of funding 3 initiatives through increased giving. As a reminder we have 3 big dreams for 2022.

For 2022, our stewardship goal of \$40,000 of increased giving will enable us to accomplish: \$10k for hunger, \$10k for homelessness and \$20K for faith formation ministries.

We have made great strides, by the end of September, together we've grown our giving by \$20,000 when compared to 2021. Thank you to

everyone for your faithful giving so far. Receiving \$20K so far is a great accomplishment. We are definitely making progress toward the ambitious goals we made in February.

We will meet our goal of increasing giving by \$40K with just a little extra help. If each of our families increases their regular giving by \$10 a month for Sept- Dec. or makes a one-time equivalent offering (\$40), we will change lives by providing food, shelter and faith formation ministries. Watch the giving thermometer in the narthex for additional progress towards our goal.

While we keep our focus on 2022 the Stewardship team is looking forward to 2023 and what can be done to accomplish our goals of Welcoming All, Serving our Neighbors and Building

Community. Watch this space, your mailbox, email and our Facebook page for news about the January 2023 Stewardship Campaign.

General Fund Update: Giving for Operations (not including the capital campaign and pre-school) YTD as of the end of Sept was \$471,755. That means that through September, we are behind budget by \$29,489.17. Thank you for your continued support. Please consider regular giving via Simply Giving to provide the resources to expand our ministry to Change Lives. If you are already participating in Simply Giving, thank you. WELCOMING JOY

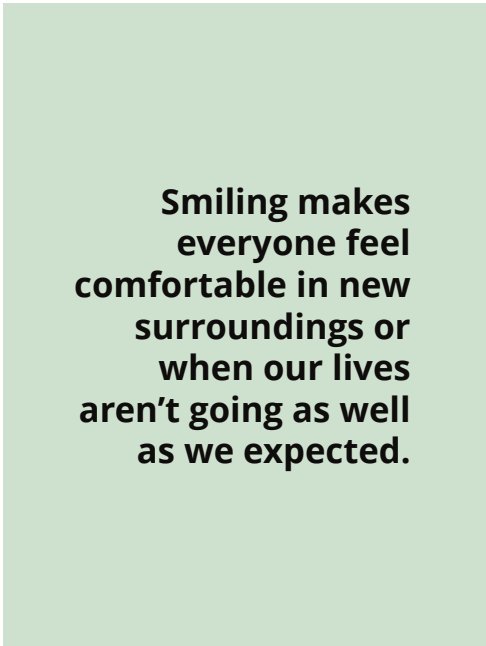


THE HOLIDAYS CAN be so stressful as we try so hard to make it picture-perfect inside and outside of our homes. I know I tried that picture-perfect look,
