MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



REGARDING FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP and meeting ministry goals at First Lutheran, 2022 was the best of times and the

worst of times. Compared to 2021, our congregation increased giving to the general fund by more than 5%. This allowed us to not only meet our obligations, like keeping the lights on, paying staff and clearing snow from the parking lot, but also two of our dreams. We cut a \$10,000 check to the Hunger Task Force and another \$10,000 check to REACH as they know how to address homelessness in our communities.

To those who shared in our church's vision to provide a meaningful gift to these efforts, I can't say thank you

enough. Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart shall go," and by devoting significant treasure to these local institutions, we will develop even greater concern and compassion for both those who suffer and those who seek to serve the suffering. This is what Faith Alive! looks like.

In my November newsletter, I asked you to...

"pray for our Call Committee, pastors and staff to provide a clear faithful picture of what life in Onalaska is like and that our church is trying to grow in every way. I want this candidate to see what God is up to among us as we seek to offer wider welcome and

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN



I LOVE DISNEY. Almost as much as I love Jesus.

The second week of January, I took a week off and visited the warm land

of Florida so that I could soak in the Disney spirit with two of my closest friends.

Here is what I learned (or relearned, or had reinforced). Welcome is a practice that requires constant attention and learning. It is what Disney does best, really. When you visit one of their parks or resorts, you are not simple a visitor or consumer, you are a guest. As such, they have prepared for you in every way they can think of. Your comfort and enjoyment is their top priority. This is not the case for any other amusement park, which I saw in stark relief when I visited the other Orlando parks.

As I reflect on my time, I can't help but make connections to the work we have been doing here at First as we work toward becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation. We have been leaning heavily into our core value of Welcome All, stretching ourselves to love more deeply, to welcome more widely. We have been challenging ourselves to learn new behaviors, new ways of connecting, new ways of speaking. All of these actions have made a difference in the lives of those who visit us and those who call themselves members.

On May 21, we will vote on the welcome statement you have heard in worship, seen printed in our announcements and discussed in small groups. Until then, continue to look for opportunities to practice wider welcome and deeper love and to learn more about how Jesus is calling us to grow deeper in our faith.

deeper love inside our fellowship and beyond our walls. Pray with me that their time with us in November will provide an irresistible opportunity to answer God's call to serve our church for years to come. Or, another way to pray this prayer is what I've been saying since May 2021, "Thy will be done..."

Thank you for your prayers! Our interview process went extremely well and negotiations went forward in earnest. We found a great match. The candidate, our staff and Pastor Karyn & I were excited about the prospects.

And then, reality struck. Sadly, as much as our giving increased in 2022, so did our expenses, along with a couple additional circumstances we couldn't know about until the end of the year. Add it all together and as we looked into 2023's budget and beyond, it became very clear that First Lutheran has not, in fact, grown the capacity to financially support a third pastor at this time.

There are two things I want to say about this reality. First of all, it's frustrating. With three kids of my own, my family is among the many who know how much potential there is for a youth and family minister to do great work here. As your Senior Pastor, I know both Pastor Karyn and I have the potential to grow into fruitful new chapters of our ministry with another colleague. So, initially, this was hard to admit... AND it was also a relief. I was relieved to recognize our true financial status before issuing a call and long before someone got hurt in this process.

So... now what? The excellent work of our Call Committee shaped a job description for a third pastor and will continue to inform how Pastor Karyn and I function into the next chapter of our ministry at First Lutheran. We have spent many months now identifying ministry opportunities, from a childrens' choir to puppet ministry, young youth and middle school youth events, Peer Ministry projects, college visits to see

members abroad, a young couple ministry, singles' ministry, more men's ministries, an increased online presence, more visitation to our elders and more. Some of these ideas are lower hanging fruit than others and all these opportunities will linger, while our staff size remains the same.

But our membership is changing. Look for invitations to lead a piece of our community! Many hands make light work and whether Pastor Karyn or I ask vou to serve as a confirmation guide. organize a one-time gathering in your home or lead a Lenten Bible study, our core value "We Build Community" will become more and more true every time members of our community step up to host, engage or lead. Our model for ministry has been clarified a bit through this process. We will not be moving further into a staff led model. We will need to pursue a model where lay people have the confidence. competence and faithfulness to offer new and wonderful parts of themselves and I am excited about that! Thanks again for your prayers as we've navigated a call process that has resulted in calling our membership into greater leadership roles for the sake of every age and stage at First!

AN INTRODUCTION FROM VICAR KATHRYN



GREETINGS AND PEACE to you in the name of Love! I wanted to give you a brief introduction to myself and my involvement at First Lutheran. My name is

Kathryn Thompson and I am a seminary at Wart burg Theological Seminary. I am in the ordination process for Word and Sacrament ministry to become a pastor in the ELCA. I have completed two years of seminary and this year is my internship year. The bulk of my internship is being done as a Chaplain Resident with Gundersen Health System. However, I also have some congregational touch points that I will complete with you at First Lutheran. I was grateful for the opportunity to help lead and preach at the Thanksgiving Eve service. I have been able to meet some of you as my family attends worship and I look forward to meeting more of you as I help with other worship services and events throughout the year.

I also wanted to provide a little bit of background about myself and how I came to answer the call to ministry. After graduating from St. Olaf college in 2010, I began my initial career of teaching as an English teacher in Minnesota. After four years there, my spouse, Sara and I moved to Decorah, lowa. I spent one year working in higher education at both Luther College and at Northeast Iowa Community College before returning to the classroom as an English teacher at Decorah High School. I taught there for five years. Throughout my entire teaching career, I also worked part time in ministry. In Minnesota, I worked as a music director at our church. After moving to lowa, I worked in Children. Youth and Family ministry at a UCC church and then at our home ELCA congregation in Decorah, For four summers, I also was

the director of a summer feeding program in Decorah that provided free meals to kids during the summer months.

After a few different attempts to answer the call to full time ministry as a pastor, I finally began seminary in the fall of 2020. Just a few months later, our kiddo, Greta was born. She is now two years old and enjoys playing outside, painting and chatting about most anything, but especially her pal and our beloved pet Labrador retriever, Gus.

I'm grateful that First Lutheran is allowing me the space and support to complete my congregational touch points this year. While you won't see me too often due to my full time work at the hospital, I do look forward to sharing in ministry with you at points throughout the year. 



FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP REPORT





THANK YOU FOR your continued financial support as we focus on bringing people into a relationship with Jesus Christ. This

Changes Lives! We have successfully completed 2022. **Thank you** for all the ways you supported First in 2022.

In 2022, our giving increased over 2021 by \$34,000 (5%) which means we will cut a \$10,000 check to the Hunger Task Force and another \$10,000 to REACH: a La Crosse collaborative that supports the homeless with skills and services they need. Thank you for making these dreams a reality.

We have some more big **dreams for 2023** and want to share them with you. When we receive \$40,000 of increased giving, we will do the following:

1. Donate \$10,000 to Safer Families for Children. It is a family preservation movement

- motivated by radical hospitality, disruptive generosity and intentional compassion to keep children safe and families together. Since 2020 48 families have been served through this local effort and all 48 remain together.
- 2. Donate \$10,000 to Lutheran World Relief to support their efforts to respond to millions of people affected by the war in Ukraine. Food, shelter, medical supplies and emergency cash are all needed by Ukrainians and LWR knows how to get them the help they need.
- 3. In 2023 we want to use \$10,000 to gather people for special events around food to build community in old ways and new. In 2022, we had our first Nosh with Neighbors event when we invited our neighborhood

- teachers and staffs to First Lutheran for a catered lunch. It was so successful we hope to take this food hospitality on the road, perhaps to Gundersen, Mayo, or other schools.
- 4. We also want to use \$10,000 of our \$40,000 increase to gather people at First through music. Inviting special guests to lead worship and perhaps lead a concert the Saturday night before. It would provide more opportunities for fellowship, fun and something a little different for worship.

One last thing: It is good for everyone—for the church and for individual families—to complete an 'intent of giving' card. Two families in Christ at First are offering a challenge gift to the rest of our family of faith that together total \$10,000. If 100 intent cards are turned in that show an intent to increase their giving, First will receive that \$10,000 in our general fund. If you have not done so already, please remember to return or complete your intent card online by Feb 12.



FAITH BUILDING BLOCKS
