MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



n 2014 First did a lot of work in creating a comprehensive strategic plan for youth discipleship, adult discipleship, worship, stewardship,

community service, hospitality, evangelism, facilities and more. What do we want our staff to look like? How do we hope to grow our budget? What ministries are we feeling most called to grow and for whom? Why? It was through this process that we identified our greatest priorities. The first and foremost priority then and now continues to be our congregation's commitment to providing kids, birth through college aged, with faith formation opportunities. In response to our plan, we hired Tina Nelson as a full-time youth director. Katie Everson continued as our Young Youth events coordinator. We also continued to prioritize Sunday School by paying a stipend to the superintendent. And First has enjoyed nothing but faithful leadership from our Sunday School leaders over the years.

Later in this newsletter you'll see that Katie Everson is moving on from serving the Young Youth, which I've known was her plan since last fall. And after the last mission trip this summer, Tina Nelson will be moving on from serving as our youth director so that she may become the program director at Sugar Creek Bible Camp. So, there is a lot of transition within the youth

Currently, we are in the process of interviewing a candidate for the youth director position and have already received multiple applications. We remain committed to keeping a full time youth director on staff who primarily works with middle, high school and post-high school kids/young adults. In addition, we are considering enlarging the scope of a young youth director who would definitely continue to organize monthly

events, but may also do a bit more with parents and families. Sunday School is in VERY good shape with Beth and Joel Miller leading. And Carla Stanton plans to return to her role as birth–3 guru by leading a Frolic class once a month.

First Lutheran has lots of goals, feeling called by the Spirit to be thoughtful and faithful as we live our lives in Christ, serving our neighbors in need and growing in knowledge and wisdom. But as much as we want to become more generous, worship well and serve the community, perhaps the greatest desire among us is to pass our faith on from one generation to the next. Know that despite the current vacancies in our youth ministry, I am working diligently to provide a robust experience full of opportunities for our kids! Fortunately, I do not have to do that work alone, as so many of you offer your wisdom and knowledge by teaching on Sundays, 'quide'ing on Wednesdays and in so many other ways.

I look forward to announcing our new staff whenever the Holy Spirit does her work. In the meantime, I ask for your prayers that the right candidates hear God's call to serve us at First!



These are politically charged times. This very sentence in the presiding bishop's column

is likely to raise eyebrows.

Across this church I've heard stories of parishioners disturbed by the Gospel read on Sundays, believing the pastor chose the passage as a critique of the current administration. The Beatitudes seemed to provoke the most attention. In a way, this is good—maybe we are all hearing Jesus' words with fresh ears. But really, the Beatitudes have been the appointed Gospel for the fourth Sunday of Epiphany (year A) for as long as we have been using the lectionary.

In these charged times it's helpful to consider two things: the relationship between church and state, and how Lutherans participate in civil society. Often, we speak about the "separation of church and state." This principle is usually raised when parishioners feel the pastor (or the synod, churchwide organization or bishop) is being "political." There is the assumption that the church should only deal with the spiritual and that it should have nothing to do with civil and political life. The First Amendment says: "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." The separation of church and state is intended to protect religious liberty and keep the government from interfering in the church.

We Lutherans also cite Martin Luther's doctrine of the two kingdoms—the temporal and the spiritual. This has been misinterpreted to mean that the temporal realm is inferior to the spiritual realm—or that In these charged times it's helpful to consider two things: the relationship between church and state, and how Lutherans participate in civil society.

God, and therefore the faithful, should not be as concerned with the temporal, should not allow the temporal into the church, and really need not be too engaged in the public square.

But our understanding as Lutherans is that the church and the state, the spiritual and the temporal, are both established by God and are both part of God's twofold rule. When we pray, "Give us today our daily bread," we are also praying that God send us the gift of good government (Luther's Small Catechism).

Both church and state are good gifts from God and have been established for specific purposes. The proper work of the church is to "preach the gospel in its purity and administer the sacraments according to the gospel" (Augsburg Confession VII). The proper work of the state is to keep peace and order and to support and nourish the lives of its citizens. And since we confess that God entered human life through the incarnation of Jesus Christ, who took our flesh upon him, we do not

have a hierarchy of value that places the spiritual above the temporal.

Active participation in public life and the duty of government to care for its people, especially the most vulnerable, have been part of the Lutheran movement from its beginning. In his explanation of the petition "Give us today our daily bread," Luther said: "It would be therefore fitting if the coat of arms of every upright prince were emblazoned with a loaf of bread instead of a lion" (Large Catechism). He also wrote that the "second virtue of a prince is to help the poor, the orphans, and the widows to justice, and to further their cause."

Lutherans don't withdraw from public life. In fact, our constitution pledges us to "work with civil authorities in areas of mutual endeavor, maintaining institutional separation of church and state in a relation of functional interaction." Lutherans fulfill our baptismal vocation when we show up.

So why are we so tense? I think we've been influenced by a divisive culture. We forget that we are one people. I think we fail to recognize Christ in others, whether the other is across the pew or across the world. We forget that we all—whatever our politics—stand under the judgment of God and that only God's promise of reconciling love in Jesus can save us. Set free by that promise we can find a way to serve the neighbor.



LISTENING HOSPITALITY GO AND DO



was bagging up my groceries the other day, when I overheard a conversation between a mom and her son. The son kept asking "why?"

with every answer the mom gave. Parents have all been in that situation. I tried to encourage her and let her know that it is exhausting answering all their questions and trying to come up with answers that the child can understand. I hope that she knew I was sympathetic toward her and that just knowing someone had listened and understood what she was going through was helpful.

Listening is a big part of hospitality. Taking the time to listen to the needs of our visitors and members alike. Hospitality isn't so much about selling our church to others, although we still need to let people know what is happening here, but to listen to the needs that they have. Then we need to connect our visitors and members with people or groups that will help them feel engaged and known by others. Everyone wants to be heard and listened to. Knowing someone has listened to one's concerns or needs makes most feel important. We may not be able to meet everyone needs, but we can listen and sympathize with them in whatever they are going through.

Mostly, I think that hospitality is a doing ministry, like welcoming others, shaking their hands, serving coffee. These things are all good and helpful, but when someone needs to talk, we need to be available to sit down or just take the time to listen to them. This is what makes our church a welcoming

church. James 1:19 tells us "You must understand this, my beloved, let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger." If we all slow down a little and listen to one another. we would become an even more welcoming place to worship and serve our God. Everyone in our congregation can do this. Listen to the person next to you as you leave worship or at a gathering with others from our church. Take the time to stay for coffee hour so that you can invite someone to talk after worship. Connecting with others and making all feel welcomed here at First is what each of us are called to do. Being that listening ear for someone is all that it might take for them to feel known and being known is all we may need to begin feeling connected at First.

I encourage each of you to slow down, listen to each other and if needed, connect one to another at First. This is my plan for the summer to slow down after worship, take the time to meet and greet as many people as I can and be a listening ear. I hope you will join me in this, staying for coffee, meeting someone new and listening to their stories. Feeling connected to the others within our congregation makes this a warm and inviting place for all, so let's start connecting with others.
