MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



ast year around this time, our Vision & Leadership Team was interviewing consultant firms who would help us with a capital campaign.

There were two basic approaches to choose from: 1) Standard fundraising approach: approach the 'big givers' of the congregation (individually) in hopes of receiving a half to two-thirds of a pre-determined 'goal'. After those initial one-on-one visits, invite everybody else (en masse) to consider a pledge of their own. The other idea was 2) Non-standard, raise-members'-engagement-with-

their-church-approach (I know it's not catchy, but it describes it well;): instead of naming a 'goal' with a limited scope, create a comprehensive "needs and opportunities" list that touches every part of what our church does and who our church wants to be. The total dollar value of that list may be beyond what the congregation chooses to give at this time, but no matter how much money is pledged, important needs and exciting opportunities will get addressed. Along with this needs and opportunities list, it was suggested we make an effort to visit every family unit (not just some).

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KARYN



Nothing says something new is happening like resurrection. Resurrection defies all scientific evidence, all philosophical

ponderings, all we know to be true. In our reality, dead is dead, new life may come with spring, but not in death of a person. It is in the resurrection of Jesus that we begin to see that our reality is not God's reality and that perhaps what God has for us, this new thing that is happening, could offer us more than we can comprehend ourselves. For if I am not worried so much about saving my life/soul, I may be willing to take some risk, to open myself up to this

more. I can't help thinking of the movie Lucy. It was by no means a good movie, in fact one of the worst I have seen, but it explores the concept of tapping into the whole of our brain and what that would do to our life in this world. What if we accessed other parts of our brain, exercised those muscles not so often used so that we could imagine God's reality where death really isn't death and life is more than we imagined? I think that is possible in some measure as we increase our knowledge of the universe by studying science and increase our knowledge of our minds as we study philosophy and increase

I would suggest the campaign was an enormous success... we will give more to this campaign than First has ever given to a single campaign before.

That's what I would call broad support that also runs deep.

Perhaps the most important success of the campaign, though, was learning how crucial it will be for our church to continue making visits.

In my mind, it seemed like we were faced with a decision to 1) create a realistic (small) goal that a few of our members would float or 2) cast a BIG vision for the entire congregation to support. Choosing the second option would mean the campaign would take longer and be far more difficult. Trying to visit over 500 family units is much more difficult, after all, than trying to get a couple dozen on board.

Of course, we chose the harder path and our leaders and I have never regretted it. A needs and opportunities list was created using our strategic plan of 2015 as our primary guide. A leaky education building roof, cracking parking lot and building codes have informed the list as well! In the end. meeting every part of the \$2.1 million list would triple our endowment (Foundation), rid us of all debt, create a cash reserve for the future and fix every broken/outdated thing in and around our facility. First Lutheran would be in a position to provide cost-of-living pay increases to their staff in coming years, be more generous to local and regional needs both within and outside our denomination and attend to the ongoing discipleship of our own members.

In April, it is six months since we launched the "Our Church + Our Time" capital campaign. Almost 250 personal visits have taken place. The feedback from these visits pertaining to our leadership, programming and mission are invaluable! More than 200 pledges have been received totaling more than \$1 million. Almost \$300,000 has already been given! Our family of faith will celebrate the completion of a VERY successful campaign April 29 between worship services. Every single member is strongly encouraged to come!

Some of us may see the final numbers and feel a sense of failure. Some may say, "We 'only' ended up visiting half of our membership. And we 'only' ended up receiving pledges that meet half of our needs and opportunities." Although each person is free to feel whatever they feel, let us please not judge this campaign as anything close to a failure. In fact, I would suggest the campaign was an enormous success. Our members pledged over a million dollars for a

campaign that will result in no new building(s). A campaign to enhance mission and address deferred maintenance is always harder than a fresh building campaign. And yet, we will give more to this campaign than First has ever given to a single campaign before. Also, our pledges were not 'top-heavy' where a few givers are responsible for most of the gifts. We reached \$1 million by having 67 families pledge more than \$3,600 over the course of the next three years. That's incredible! That's what I would call broad support that also runs deep.

Perhaps the most important success of the campaign, though, was learning how crucial it will be for our church to continue making visits. I will be creating a visitation team whose happy task shall be to make one-on-one visits with NO AGENDA except to connect in Christian fellowship. In these visits, visitors will ask how First is doing in meeting members' spiritual needs. We will update contact information and share the latest news from what the church is up to. But these visits will be done outside of a capital campaign context so those who feel uncomfortable talking about money can trust that our visitation team simply comes in peace; the peace of Christ.

Join us April 29 for the celebration! And look for more information in the near future about our visitation team. We will need dozens of visitors!

our knowledge of spirit and we study the arts. All of these things expand our understanding of what it means to be human and I think, what it means to be created in the image of God.

So often, I find myself gravitating toward the science or philosophy, but what I have come to discover is that where it all comes together for me is when I slow down enough to pay attention to the art. That is why my sabbatical will be centered around art and connection. For those of you at the annual meeting, you heard an overview of what I will be doing those three months I am gone. As I approach the time of my sabbatical, I will spend some time talking about each component of my time away and what the sabbatical team is working on for the congregation to do during that time too. My hope is that as we are attentive to these things we can all increase our knowledge of new things and grow as human beings.

My first few weeks will find me easing my way into sabbatical. The first week will be spent at home, preparing for my long absence, getting my place ready for my parents to stay and resting. There will be no alarms waking me in the mornings, no real scheduling to each day, simply a gentle unfolding to each day as a way to get back in tune with the natural rhythms of my heart and soul and body. After a week of resting and preparing, I will head out to Bozeman, MT, where extended family live. I will spend two weeks there, enjoying the outdoors, family and well, more rest. I will also begin to explore new art mediums, mainly weaving and pottery. I am an extrovert and as such, physical activity often provides an avenue for reflection and deeper awareness. It made sense to me to dive into some forms of art that are very tactile. I have connected with two artists who will teach me and will have studio time at Bozeman's art center. While I

learn these new things, I will meet with an art therapist who will help me work through whatever churns up and help me set good habits for the rest of my sabbatical. Time with three of my littles, my cousins, aunt and uncle will round out my time, helping me ease into time away from all I know and hold dear here.

During this time, the congregation will be offered the opportunity to learn pottery, too, and there will be hikes sponsored by various groups, encouraging everyone to get outside and enjoy the natural beauty around us. The Sunday School classes will keep track of my movements by learning about Bozeman and connecting the dots of my travels on a large world map. You will be gathering around the theme *Tell the Story* and will be encouraged to use art and nature as ways to learn the your story, God's story and neighbor's story.

The fun part is, you don't have to wait! Already I have begun to make art a regular part of my life—mostly because I have discovered this hole in my knowledge and the knowledge becoming wisdom. Someone very wise told me not too long ago that to become wise, one must make room for wisdom to arow, for stillness to exist so that knowledge can be integrated into your self and become wisdom. It kinda rocked my world, this little tidbit and in such a timely way as I get ready to allow space for wisdom to grow through sabbatical time and even now, through intentional creative time. I hope you have found the thing that brings it all together for you. I would love to hear about it.



FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

First Lutheran Church YTD Financial Summary 2 Month Ending, February 28, 2018





The following is a financial summary through the end of February:

Actual receipts -\$95,943.37

Budgeted receipts -\$104,200.00

Actual expenses -\$130,058.46

Budgeted expenses -\$137,562.00

Our total receipts through the end of February fell short of the current year budgeted amount by \$8,256.63. Our total giving (general fund and other miscellaneous offerings) fell short of our current year budgeted amount by \$7,403.99 or 8.3%. In addition, our total receipts through the end of February

fell short of the total receipts through the same period last year by \$6,857.24.

As noted above, our expenses are less than budgeted through the end of February by \$7,503.54. The majority of this favorable variance is due to the timing of certain expenses.

In summary, we budgeted for a deficit of \$33,362.00 through the end of February and have realized an actual deficit of \$34,115.09.

In addition to the above noted operating receipts and expenses we received \$16,377.81 for our capital campaign in February and incurred expenses associated with our capital campaign of \$285.80. Cumulative receipts and expenses associated with our capital campaign through the

end of January are \$257,644.85 and \$119,037.03, respectively.

As always, full details of this report are available by request in the church office. Also, everyone is welcome to attend a finance committee meeting—we meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon in the Thomas Room.






