in our past. The V&L Team have lived everywhere from Massachusetts to California and dozens of places in between. We have worshipped at tiny rural churches and enormous metropolitan churches. In the end, we talked about how First Lutheran, Onalaska, in 2018 continues to be a large church that seeks to create ways of feeling smaller through the ways we worship, serve and learn. It's a great challenge that more and more leaders are choosing to help answer.

On Saturday, we talked about our options regarding the ways we make use of the funds being gathered from the capital campaign. Our feedback

from over 200 visits told us there is great concern about prioritizing the deferred maintenance 'needs' of the property. There are also many among our membership who feel strongly about freeing up more of our annual gifts by ridding ourselves of mortgage payments. In the midst of these conversations, our Foundation Board came to us recently to ask for guidance about how to do their work well in light of by-laws that require updating.

The results of our conversations are exciting. First of all, we know that nobody wants any capital campaign moneys to be spent (even if it's pledged) before it is actually received. So, if we do want to pay off the mortgage and reshingle the sanctuary roof—which together will cost more than \$500,000—we will probably NOT be accomplishing those goals before 2020. In the meantime, though, other less expensive priorities could be done. Resurfacing the parking lot, updating our smoke alarm systems, replacing the flooring in the education building, adding handicapped door buttons in the narthex bathrooms and lighting the Good Shepherd window in the sanctuary are all in the range of possibility if gifts are given as they have been pledged. Raising over \$1 million allows First Lutheran to address every deferred maintenance need while also meeting a few opportunities. This is indeed exciting, as our leadership will be free in years to come to make plans without the doom of leaky ceilings over their heads (literally).

But not every opportunity could be met, of course. Creating a significant capital reserve fund for the next big maintenance need in addition to a cash reserve fund to help our church get through lean summer months without taking short-term loans will not happen. However, as our V&L Team considered

the request from our Foundation Board for greater guidance, we came up with an idea that should build such reserves over time. If all memorial gifts and other special gifts made to First Lutheran were put directly into the Foundation, the principal would grow each year. In the course of 10 years, through investments and gifts, the Foundation principal could double or even triple. That principal usually generates 5-10% interest. These interest amounts could be the future source of a capital reserve, cash reserve and allow First to be more generous to the Synod. Sugar Creek Bible Camp, Lutheran Social Services and more. In short, the Foundation could be an essential part of how First Lutheran will thrive in the future, perhaps without needing to conduct large-scale capital campaigns (maybe I'm wishing here).

I hope you'll 'stay tuned' to hear more about the choices our leadership are making and feel free to contribute toward the discussion. We will update a sign in the narthex each time capital campaign funds get used, which will also be shown in the monthly newsletter. From time to time, we will also have a V&L member offer an update during the offering at worship. We've already updated the HVAC controls and put a new roof on the education building. Like I said, these are exciting times at First Lutheran!

FIRST LUTHERAN FOUNDATION REPORT

FUNDS GIVEN TO SCHOLARSHIPS IN 2018

The First Lutheran Foundation scholarship committee has awarded scholarships to 10 high school graduates to help with their post-secondary education. The recipients are: William Brewer, Dane Carl, Parker Clark, Danny Garrity, Katie Larkin, Olivia Leppert, Carter Melby, Collin Roes, Carson Schultz, and Emily Wittkop. Each will receive \$300 through the Mabel Anderson Scholarship program. The money is awarded after the recipient submits his or her first-semester grades.

The Foundation/Endowment Fund was established in December 1989 upon the passing of Ms. Mabel L. Anderson. Mabel was a longtime member of First Lutheran, having been baptized and confirmed here. Her will/trust bequest a substantial sum to First Lutheran in memory of her parents Peder and Johanna Anderson. It was Mabel's wish that this monetary gift would enable further growth of our church, its ministries and stewardship within the community.

Per the Foundation's bylaws, 5% of its total assets can be spent each year towards four categories: 1) Mabel Anderson Scholarships (for graduating high school seniors); 2) community outreach, such as Salvation Army, local food pantries, and New Horizons; 3) ELCA-related missions, such as Sugar Creek Bible Camp, First Lutheran Helping Hands, and youth trips; and 4) capital improvements for First Lutheran. In the past 4–5 years, the Foundation has graciously donated more than \$10,000 towards these four categories.

Contributions to the Foundation Fund are not spent, but invested. The money is held in a couple of low-risk investment funds and money market accounts. Year after year the interest earned from this fund is used to expand our outreach and ministries. Therefore, contributions made to the fund serve as "seeds" that keep on giving. Contributions may be made through simple gifts, wills & trusts via estate planning, memorials and beneficiary through life insurance policies. Any amount is welcome and greatly appreciated.

I can't remember a time in my adult life when a work or school schedule didn't dictate how to spend my time.

During this 3 week period, I will be traveling to Europe. First to Germany with my father to explore our ancestral homeland. We will spend a couple days in Chicago before heading over to Berlin, where we will join with others for a tour that will take us to Dresden, Weimar, Rothenburg, Neuschwanstein, Oberammergau, Marienplatz and Munich (just in time for Oktoberfest!). After the tour, we will be on our own to toodle around and explore southern Germany where our family came from, exploring some historical sites, visiting car museums and (I hope) getting a chance to race really fast cars around a track.

During this time, the Sabbatical Team will be providing you with classes on ancestry research, helping our middle and high school groups film the stories of our church family and teaching our Sunday school the Biblical family tree.

After Germany, I will head to Paris, where I will meet up with my best friend and my sister. We plan on visiting an art museum each day as we explore the spiritual practice of visio divina, there will be afternoons on

the terraces of coffee shops sipping cafe au laits and enjoying a pastry as we take a break from walking around various neighborhoods and evenings eating amazing food. We will also travel to Chartres Cathedral, where the oldest inlaid labyrinth is, for the opportunity to walk it. This has long been a hope of mine, and I am so thankful I will get the chance to do it.

After a week in Paris we will board a train for Amsterdam. Van Gogh has long been my favorite artist, and I am excited to explore this city he loved and immerse myself in his art in a new way.

Throughout our time in these two charming cities we will be spending intentional time talking about connections we have been making and ways we are growing in our faith and understanding of ourselves and God.

While I am doing that, practitioners of Visio Divina and Meditation will be invited to First to teach about these things.

I am awed by what I have been gifted with, both the time and the grant money. I am also a little concerned about what life will be like not working for three months. Not that there won't be plenty to do. but I can't remember a time in my adult life when a work or school schedule didn't dictate how to spend my time. I love my work, and it greatly defines who I am, so not working for three months, well it promises to be a time of great growth. I am very glad that I have some amazing people to journey with me during these months. Thank YOU for all you do that has made this amazing time possible!


HELPING HANDS

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT





The following is a financial summary through the end of April:

Actual receipts - \$241,443.32

Budgeted receipts -\$263,450.00

Actual expenses - \$265,609.00

Budgeted expenses -\$283,286.00

Our total receipts through the end of April fell short of the current year budgeted amount by \$22,006.68. Our total giving (general fund and other miscellaneous offerings) fell short of our current year budgeted amount by \$20,036.19 or 9.1%.

As noted above, our expenses are less than budgeted through the end of April by \$17,677.00. The majority of this favorable variance is due to the timing of certain expenses.

In summary, we budgeted for a deficit of \$19,836.00 through the end of April and have realized an actual deficit of \$24.165.68.

In addition to the above noted operating receipts and expenses, we received \$27,581.65 for our capital campaign in April and incurred expenses associated with our capital campaign of \$1,040.36. Cumulative receipts and expenses associated with our capital campaign through the end of April are \$306,771.93 and \$130,987.34, respectively.

As always, full details of this report are available by request in the church office. Also, everyone is welcome to attend a finance committee meeting—we meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon in the Thomas Room.


