MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON



remember learning in high school about John D. Rockefeller and how he created a monopoly in the oil business through "vertical integration."

Vertical integration is one of those phrases you have to learn for a vocabulary test and then never have to know again, but I think it's worth knowing about as we think about where our church has been and where we're trying to go.

By 1911, Standard Oil controlled 85% of the US Oil industry. Notice: Standard didn't own 85% of just the oil, but the whole industry... mineral rights, pipelines, refineries, gas stations and every other part of the industry from the beginning of production to the moment a consumer made a purchase. By owning every part of the business, Rockefeller could control supply, driving up demand whenever he felt like it. By being so large, he could squeeze out competition and become "too large to fail" (to use a 21st century term).

There was a time not so long ago when individual churches tried to behave like a vertically integrated monopoly, becoming so large and independent that they wouldn't need anyone else. Dominate the "religious marketplace" and squeeze out the 'competition' as though churches are playing a zero sum game. In this model, 'membership' at a church meant you never stepped foot in another church

building... unless it was for a funeral or a wedding (maybe).

The religious world has changed a lot in the last 20 years, though. Although still important, the building and the programs have waned in importance. Generation X, Y, millenials and Generation Z don't care about the denomination name or doctrine as much as how a church's beliefs shape their actions. Who do you welcome? Who do you serve? Who gets to lead? How can I contribute?

their gifts is a challenge. And to do so, thriving churches in 2018 build and maintain robust partnerships. First Lutheran has been developing partnerships for many years. The most obvious and longstanding is the place we have within the La Crosse Area Synod of the ELCA. Nearly 10% of First Lutheran receipts are passed on to the work of our synod, which passes on 50% of its receipts to the Churchwide Unit of the ELCA. These are monies that support Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (for almost 80 years!), Lutheran Disaster Response, seminaries, missionaries and so much more. But just in the last 10-15 years, First's role within our synod has changed as we have claimed stronger partnership with our local Campus Ministry that serves UW-L. Viterbo and Western. We are also more closely tied to Sugar Creek Bible Camp and Lutheran Social Services. Serving college kids, summer campers and those who are most vulnerable

The First Teen Clothes Closet is again partnering with Trinity Lutheran in La Crosse and the Children's Clothes Closet there to provide back-toschool athletic shoes for children and teens in the Northside neighborhood. Last year we donated 167 pairs of shoes! We would graciously accept donations of NEW athletic shoes appropriate for teens (men's sizes 7-13, women's sizes 5-12) or monetary donations to buy shoes for teens. We're moving! While the current location has served us well, the steering committee has felt for some time now that it doesn't serve our

guests as well as we wish it would. Our location in Onalaska is convenient for us, but not as convenient for the majority of the region's teens in need, many of whom live on the north side of La Crosse with limited access to transportation, making it difficult to get to downtown Onalaska on weekends and evenings. While we have had success with our shuttle from the Children's Clothes Closet at Trinity Lutheran Church, we believe there are many more teens we should be serving, so we are taking that collaboration to the next level.

The First Teen Clothes Closet is relocating to space available at Trinity Lutheran, so we can provide families with a single stop for clothing for both children and teens in a location that they can more easily access. We hope to be in place before the Aug. 13 shoe distribution and block party at Trinity.

Here's how you can help:

- 1. Pray for a smooth transition to our new location over the summer.
- 2. Help with the transition itself—we will need volunteers to assist with taking clothes off the racks & shelves at the current location; disassembling & reassembling racks & shelves in our new location; and moving clothes to the new location to get everything set up.

All of these tasks will be done from mid-July through early August.

We'll need willing hands and legs to relocate clothes from the second floor of the house to the downstairs so that

the shelves can be taken down—this could be a great volunteer opportunity for teens!

We need a few mechanicallyminded individuals to disassemble, move and reassemble all of the shelving and racks.

And then we'll need more "movers" to get the clothes to Trinity and onto racks and shelves in our new location.

Specific dates and times are still being nailed down, so watch for information on the church and Clothes Closet Facebook pages or in the bulletin and additional emails. If you can help with one of these tasks, please contact a committee member or the church office so we can notify you directly when we have more specifics.

We will continue to use space at the house for sorting donations and having

teens approve the clothes before offering them to our guests.

We hope the congregation will join us in our excitement about the potential we have to serve more teens in need by taking the clothes to where they live, rather than expecting them all to come to us.

Costs: paddle board rental \$10, kayak and canoe rental \$7, box lunch \$7. Bring your own beverage.


All rentals are for 4 hours and include life vest.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT





The following is a financial summary through the end of May:

Actual receipts - \$338,508.44

Budgeted receipts -\$365,450.00

Actual expenses - \$330,145.22

Budgeted expenses - \$349,353.01

Our total receipts through the end of May fell short of the current year budgeted amount by \$26,941.56. Our total giving (general fund and other miscellaneous offerings) fell short of our current year budgeted amount by \$23,754.17 or 7.9%. In addition, our total receipts through the end of May fell

short of our total receipts through the same period last year by \$10,569.40 or 3.7%.

As noted above, our expenses are less than budgeted through the end of May by \$19,207.79. The majority of this favorable variance is due to the timing of certain expenses.

In summary, we budgeted for a surplus of \$16,097.00 through the end of May and have realized an actual surplus of \$8,363.22.

In addition to the above noted operating receipts and expenses we received \$45,673.49 for our capital campaign in May and incurred expenses associated with our capital campaign of \$60,727.16. The majority of the expenses were associated with roof repairs made to the education

building. Cumulative receipts and expenses associated with our capital campaign through the end of May are \$352,445.42 and \$191,714.50, respectively.

As always, full details of this report are available by request in the church office. Also, everyone is welcome to attend a finance committee meeting—we meet every month, on the second Wednesday, at noon in the Thomas Room.

DRAWING FROM THE WELL


Next retreat: Sat., July 14, 11:30am-2pm, at David Reay's

has always been important to First Lutheran. But in the last decade or so, we have increased our giving and presence within these ministries.

At our annual synod assembly in June our synod formally established a companion relationship with the Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren, which is in addition to the companion relationship we already have with the Lutheran Church of Peru and the domestic companions we share ministry with in the Southeastern synod of the ELCA, which covers Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Kentucky and Tennessee. These invaluable partnerships broaden our understanding of Christ's presence and work amongst God's people.


Our First Teen Clothes Closet has partnered locally with what is now the La Crosse Foundation for the last three years so that we can provide shoes, hygiene products and new

underwear for youth who need them. We have also been collaborating in important ways with other clothes closets at Trinity on the northside and Our Savior's downtown. As our lead volunteers assess the status of our clothes closet, they have recommended (which the Vision and Leadership Team approved in June) a move: let's bring the Teen Clothes Closet to the people who need it rather than asking them to bring themselves to us. The aforementioned Trinity Lutheran has its own kids clothes closet and has the space to spare for our teen clothes as well. Building on this partnership, then, we will be using the next couple of months to relocate our Teen Clothes Closet ministry to Trinity in hopes that more teens will make use of the generosity of our members. Nothing else really will change as our members will still contribute and sort clothes, receive clients and manage the publicity. The only difference will be where it all takes place.

First Lutheran is changing lives, but not just while our members are gathered in our walls. And not just within these walls! Through many partnerships, our work extends into places of need locally, regionally and globally. We won't even attempt to create an institution that doesn't need anyone else in order to thrive. Instead, First Lutheran will stand with others who seek to "proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made and work for justice and peace."

WHAT IT MEANS FOR ME TO BE A COMPANION MINISTER



One Sunday after church service, there were tables set up with lists of different opportunities to volunteer. I thought this would be a way to give back for the caring and kindness, I received after my husband passed away. I added my name to a couple of lists and then came to the companion ministry list, which was asking for volunteers to bring communion to those who were unable to get out. I wondered if I would feel comfortable doing that and was I good (spiritually) enough? I remembered some of my elderly family members having communion brought to them and how much they appreciated that. So I decided to try it. It is one of the best things I do! I enjoy visiting with each person and hearing their stories. They have a strong faith and receiving communion means a lot. I feel doing companion ministry has strengthened my own faith. They alway say to me, "Thank you, thank you for bringing me communion" but I tell them, "Thank you for letting me."

The gift of communion is Christ's invitation for us all. Homebound members or those in nursing home care cannot make it to church and still would love to also receive that gift. Companion ministers help provide the service of delivering communion to them. They visit these members, usually monthly, give them communion, and have wonderful conversations. Good friendships are formed and the members receiving the communion feel grateful for that gift. If you love visiting with and helping people, consider becoming a companion minister. HOSPITALITY MINGLERS



have a wonderful friend who loves connecting people to one another. Whenever she gathers people, she will introduce everyone to everyone. I

come into her house and she asks me right away "do you know everyone?" I usually say yes, because I usually do, but she still goes around introducing me to her family and friends. She wants us to feel connected with one another. It would be wonderful if we had people like my friend, here at church who wanted everyone to feel connected.

A hospitality mingler could be that person. Someone in the narthex mingling with everyone and helping people make connections. If someone needed to know about a class, Sunday school, or an event, the mingler would take that person to the Welcome Center, so our welcome center staff could help them out. The mingler could help someone connect with someone in their same circumstance like those with children, empty nesters, those retired or anything that would connect them. Our minglers would not stand inside the door, waiting for people, but be among them getting to know all who came into church. They could help people find their name tags or help them make one. They could help a young family coming in to find the nursery and activity bags, or let them know about Frolic and Sunday school.

We could also have hospitality minglers in the sanctuary, getting to know those who sit regularly in the same pew. They could introduce newcomers to our regulars. They could help find seats when church starts getting full and encourage people to move to the middle or sit closer to the

front. They could help a visitor find a place to sit, maybe next to a regular attender, so the regular attender can help the visitor navigate through our worship service. They could get an offering envelope if someone forgot theirs at home. Making sure that if someone with a cane, walker or in a wheelchair feels comfortable going up for communion or if they would like the a pastor to come to them.

In this way, with minglers in the narthex and in the sanctuary, we will begin making connections with one another that are more genuine than a "good morning" at the front door. As people gather together, within the narthex and then within the sanctuary, these spaces begin to look like the Kingdom of God, where the world and the Word meet. For Jesus said in Matthew 18:20, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

So many of us do this already; we welcome each other with a gracious "How are you?" "How've you been?" "It's so good to see you," so now instead of just doing this with those we know, how about doing it with everyone. If we had a small group of minglers starting to do this each Sunday and Wednesday, I would hope that by their example, all of us would be minglers for God.




