MESSAGE FROM BISHOP ARENDS

VESELÉ VÁNOCE—iFELIZ NAVIDAD!—MERRY CHRISTMAS!



At Christmas in our new companion synod, the Evangelical Church Czech Brethren, the incarnate Christ is seen. Jesus is active, living in

those who kept faithful through many years of communism. Jesus is alive in social service agencies, many operated by the ECCB, touching lives in need. Jesus enfleshed is proclaimed and sung and worshipped in a body of faith that dates back 600 years, 100 years before Luther, a body that preached the gospel in the language of the people and served the wine as well as the bread in daily communion. Christ lives in Czech Christmas.

The Christ of Christmas lives, too, in the Lutheran Church of Peru (IL-P). Through the church, Jesus stands with abandoned and beaten women and children. Jesus is seen standing up to government actions that ravage the environment, that persecute LGBTQ+peoples, that fail the poor in forgotten parts of cities and rural areas alike. Jesus is born anew as the pastors and members of IL-P sing Christmas songs and preach of Jesus, born in the stable, to humble parents, visited by peasant shepherds. Jesus is seen in Peruvian Christmas.

How will the Christ be seen among us this Christmas?

Here, too, in the La Crosse Area Synod, Jesus is born again and again. The Light of the World uses us to make God's presence known. How will the Christ be seen among us this Christmas? What needs do you strive to meet in Jesus' name? What actions are you taking that reveal Jesus in our midst? What words of Christ's love will be on your lips? What hearts will be touched by God in you? We, too, will proclaim the Light in our darkest neighborhoods. Jesus will be born in our Christmas. But how?



The Foundation/Endowment Fund was established in December 1989 upon the passing of Ms. Mabel L. Anderson. Mabel was a longtime member of First Lutheran, having been baptized and confirmed here. Her will/trust bequested a substantial sum to First Lutheran in memory of her parents Peder and Johanna Anderson. It was Mabel's wish that this monetary gift would enable further growth of our church, its ministries and stewardship within the community.

Per the Foundation's bylaws, 5% of its total assets can be spent each year toward four categories: 1) Mabel Anderson Scholarships (for graduating high school seniors); 2) community outreach, such as Salvation Army, local food pantries and New Horizons; 3) ELCA-related missions, such as Sugar Creek Bible Camp, First Lutheran Helping Hands and youth trips; and 4) capital improvements for First Lutheran. In the past 4–5 years, the Foundation has graciously donated more than \$10,000 towards these four categories.

Contributions to the Foundation Fund are not spent, but invested. The money is held in a couple of low-risk investment funds and money market accounts. Year after year the interest earned from this fund is used to expand our outreach and ministries. Therefore, contributions made to the fund serve as "seeds" that keep on giving. Contributions may be made through simple gifts, wills & trusts via estate planning, memorials and beneficiary through life insurance policies. Any amount is welcome and greatly appreciated.



At the end of October, we are 83% of the way through the year and have received 70% of the expected 2018 income. Capital Campaign update: Most recently, it has funded the repair and coating of the parking lot. This will make our parking lot safer now and for the coming winter. Planning is now taking place to upgrade the smoke alarm and Wi-Fi system. This will make our education facility safer for our children and provide teachers additional internet resources to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to our children. It's great to report we have received 42% of the pledged income for the capital campaign. Thank you to everyone for your pledge and continued donations.

WRAPPED IN LOVE



y warmest memories are of wrapping up one of my girls in a beach towel after they have played in the water and snuggling with them to

get them warmed up again so that they can go back in the water to play. Wrapping them up and holding them close to me was one of the things I enjoyed most as my girls where growing up. I still like to wrap my arms around them holding them close to me. Being wrapped in warmth whether in the summer or in the winter, like your hands around a warm cup of coffee or cocoa, is one of the best feelings.

Our prayer shawls do the same thing. They wrap around someone who is going through a rough time, bringing them comfort. Our prayer shawls remind those who are given the shawls that they are not alone as they struggle with the pain of losing someone close or dealing with a life threatening illness. Our baptism shawls remind parents that they are not alone in raising their child. We have a whole congregation to be living examples of Christs' love. Our wedding shawls remind couples to include God in their marriage, as well as in their wedding. Every time I see a shawl. I'm reminded that God's love is wrapped around each of His children.

This time of year we remember that God sent Jesus into our world as an infant; as Luke 2:7 says, "And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." Mary wrapped baby Jesus up in bands of cloth; our knitters wrap shawls around those who need to know that God's love is always with them.

Each shawl is blessed with a prayer and blessed with the hands that have made them. A card with a prayer goes with each shawl and we record where each one goes. I've heard that many of these shawls bring not only warmth but contentment knowing that they are wrapped in God's love. These shawls are cherished by those who have been given them. The shawl ministry is one of the visible reminders that God is near to us when we are going through a difficult time or a joyful time such as a baptism or wedding.

Our shawl knitters gather to knit on Wednesday evenings starting at 5:30pm. They knit and pray together, encouraging each other, laughing with one another and welcoming all who come to sit with them. Our knitters would love to have more knitters join them on Wednesdays. You bring your needles; we'll supply the yarn and the fellowship to do this important ministry. Our knitters are a blessing to all who receive a shawl and are blessed through their service of knitting. So far this year; we have given away 47 shawls and we have only a few adults shawls left. If you've been a knitter for years or are just starting out, you and your knitting needles will be welcomed into this group.

I hope that our knitters will continue to be blessed through their service of knitting and that one or more men or women, young or old, will join in the blessing of knitting for others.
